And I think Doreen, you've been our Abraham Lincoln leading during the difficult crisis of the virus and helping to advance the State's clean energy infrastructure. I firmly believe there no challenge poses a greater threat to our future than climate change. And no institution is better poised to meet that challenge head on than NYSERDA. And I am delighted to now lead the Authority into that future that we are collectively pursuing as a State. I am told that with this appointment, I am now the first President of NYSERDA who has previously held staff roles across the Authority.
