Highlights

- In the past week, the New York State average-weekly retail gasoline price increased 2.1% to \$3.865/gallon and diesel was up 1.0% to \$4.130/gallon.
- Contributing to the fuel price increase are recent increases in crude oil prices as well as ongoing drought conditions in the U.S. Midwest, which have pushed up the price of corn-derived ethanol approximately 25% since June 1, 2012. On average, ethanol makes up nearly 10% of the total gasoline mix in New York State.
- East Coast ethanol inventories fell 3.5% in the past week.

Retail Prices

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

Regular Gasoline— As of August 13, 2012, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average regular gasoline price equaled \$3.900/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$3.907/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.007/gallon (0.2%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

Diesel— As of August 13, 2012, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average diesel price equaled \$4.159/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$4.254/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.095/gallon (2.2%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.


Crude Oil Spot Prices



WTI—For the week ending August 3, 2012, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$89.10/bbl, an increase of \$0.22/bbl (0.2%) from the week-ago average of \$88.88/bbl. WTI prices are now \$1.75/bbl (1.9%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$90.85/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

Brent—For the week ending August 3, 2012, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$107.27/bbl,





an increase of \$3.09 /bbl (3.0%) from the week-ago average of \$104.18/bbl. Brent prices are now \$5.38/bbl (4.8%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$112.65/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.
