


Highlights

- The weekly average U.S. WTI crude oil spot price decreased by \$1.91 per barrel (3.9%) since last week to \$46.57 per barrel, the lowest price since November 2016, and is now 7.2% below the year ago price of \$50.18/ barrel.
- Mid-Atlantic ultra-low sulfur distillate inventories decreased by 2.7% since last week but remain 0.3% above the year-ago level.
- New York statewide average retail prices of ultra-low sulfur (ULS) heating oil, kerosene, and propane all decreased since the last survey.

Retail Petroleum Prices—On a statewide basis since the last survey on May 29th, prices decreased \$0.049/gallon (1.9%) to \$2.544 gallon for ULS heating oil, \$0.032/gallon (1.1%) to \$2.978/gallon for kerosene, and \$0.033/gallon (1.3%) to \$2.561/gallon for propane. Compared to a year earlier, prices increased \$0.169/gallon (7.1%) for heating oil, \$0.203/gallon (7.3%) for kerosene and \$0.320/gallon (14.3%) for propane.

Crude Oil Prices—For the week ending 6/9/17, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$46.57/bbl, a decrease of \$1.91/bbl (3.9%) from the week-ago average of \$48.48/bbl. WTI prices are now \$3.61/bbl (7.2%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$50.18/bbl. The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred on 7/04/08.

Spot Natural Gas Prices—For the week ending 6/9/17, Henry Hub natural gas spot prices averaged \$2.958 per million Btu (mmBtu), an increase of \$0.003/mmBtu (0.1%) from the prior week level of \$2.955/mmBtu. Prices are currently \$0.632/mmBtu (27.2%) above the year-earlier weekly average of \$2.326/mmBtu.



Residential Natural Gas Prices—The NYS average price in March 2017 was \$1.039/therm, a decrease of \$0.023/therm (2.2%) from the prior month of \$1.062/therm, and was \$0.106/therm (11.3%) higher than the year earlier average of \$0.933/therm.


- Heating oil—highest price \$4.778/gallon on 7/14/08, lowest price \$0.876/gallon on 9/08/98.




Heating Degree Days— Until the start of the next heating season in October, the heating degree day information below reflects weekly information through April 29, 2017. On a cumulative statewide basis from October 1st through April 29th current year heating degree-days (5,192) end the season ahead of the year-ago level (5,036) by 3.1% and behind the normal trend (5,777) by 10.1%.








Propane Stocks—Current and historic heating fuel inventory data is presented in the graphs below.



Retail Btu Price Equivalents—The New York State Heating Fuel Prices Btu graph equates the retail price for New York Statewide average residential ultra-low sulfur heating oil, kerosene, propane, and natural gas on a dollar per million Btu (MMBtu) basis.

Spot Btu Price Equivalents—The Btu spot market graph equates the spot market price, in table below, for NY Harbor ultra-low sulfur diesel fuel and 0.3% sulfur high pour #6 residual fuel, Mont Belvieu propane, and the New York City gate natural gas price on a dollar per million Btu (MMBtu) basis.
