


Highlights

- For the week ending December 16, New York statewide heating degree-days (277) were 3.7% more than last year and 19.9% greater than the 30-year normal. Cumulative New York statewide heating degree-days since October 1st (1,474) are ahead of last year (1,435) by 2.7% and behind the 30-year normal (1,582) by 6.8%.
- Mid-Atlantic ultra-low sulfur (ULS) distillate stocks for the current week increased by 0.3 million barrels (1.2%) since last week and are now 24.3% below last year’s level but 32.1% above the 5-year average.
- For the 10th week in a row, New York statewide average retail prices of ultra-low sulfur (ULS) heating oil, kerosene, and propane all increased since the last survey.

Retail Petroleum Prices—On a statewide basis since the last survey on December 11th, prices increased \$0.028/gallon (1.0%) to \$2.964/gallon for ULS heating oil, \$0.037/gallon (1.1%) to \$3.366/gallon for kerosene, and \$0.036/gallon (1.2%) to \$2.933/gallon for propane. Compared to a year earlier, prices increased \$0.330/gallon (12.5%) for heating oil, \$0.315/gallon (10.3%) for kerosene and \$0.435/gallon (17.4%) for propane.

Crude Oil Prices—For the week ending 12/15/17, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$57.17/bbl, an increase of \$0.25/bbl (0.4%) from the week-ago average of \$56.92/bbl. WTI prices are now \$5.26/bbl (10.1%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$51.91/bbl. The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred on 7/04/08.

Spot Natural Gas Prices—For the week ending 12/15/17, Henry Hub natural gas spot prices averaged \$2.714 per million Btu (mmBtu), a decrease of \$0.130/mmBtu (4.6%) from the prior week level of \$2.844/mmBtu. Prices are currently \$0.824/mmBtu (23.3%) below the year-earlier weekly average of \$3.538/mmBtu.



Residential Natural Gas Prices—The NYS average price in September 2017 was \$1.741/therm, a decrease of \$0.090/therm (4.9%) from the prior month of \$1.831/therm, and was \$0.063/therm (3.8%) higher than the year earlier average of \$1.678/therm.

Historic Retail Prices—Statewide average high and low prices since Sept. 1997 for heating oil & propane & Sept. 2000 for kerosene.


- Heating oil—highest price \$4.778/gallon on 7/14/08, lowest price \$0.876/gallon on 9/08/98.




Heating Degree Days— On a statewide basis during the past week, the number of heating degree-days (277) was 3.7% above the year-ago level of (267) and 19.9% above the normal trend (231). On a cumulative basis since October 1st, current year heating degree-days (1,474) are ahead of the year-ago level (1,435) by 2.7% and behind the normal trend (1,582) by 6.8%.






Propane Stocks—Current and historic heating fuel inventory data is presented in the graphs below.




Retail Btu Price Equivalents—The New York State Heating Fuel Prices Btu graph equates the retail price for New York Statewide average residential ultra-low sulfur heating oil, kerosene, propane, and natural gas on a dollar per million Btu (MMBtu) basis.



Note: Natural gas prices are from the U.S. EIA and provided on a monthly basis and delayed by 3 months.

Spot Btu Price Equivalents—The Btu spot market graph equates the spot market price, in table below, for NY Harbor ultra-low sulfur diesel fuel and 0.3% sulfur high pour #6 residual fuel, Mont Belvieu propane, and the New York City gate natural gas price on a dollar per million Btu (MMBtu) basis.
