

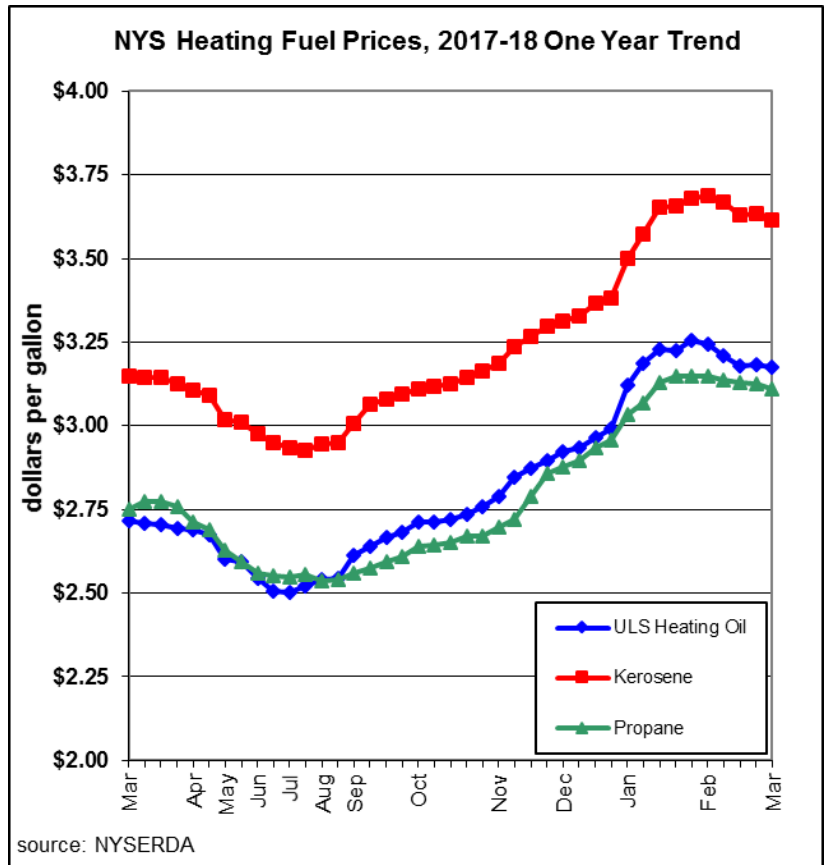
Highlights

- Cumulative New York statewide heating degree-days since October 1st (4,252) are ahead of last year (3,852) by 10.4% but behind the 30-year normal (4,442) by 4.3%.
- Mid-Atlantic ultra-low sulfur (ULS) distillate stocks increased by 0.3 million barrels (1.3%) since last week and are now 26.3% below last year’s level but 29.0% above the 5-year average.
- Mid-Atlantic propane stocks decreased by 90,000 barrels (4.9%) since last week and are now 13.4% below last year’s level but 44.9% above the 5-year average.

Retail Petroleum Prices—On a statewide basis since the last survey on February 26th, prices decreased \$0.005/gallon (0.2%) to \$3.177/gallon for ULS heating oil, \$0.017/gallon (0.5%) to \$3.616/gallon for kerosene, and \$0.014/gallon (0.4%) to \$3.112/gallon for propane. Compared to a year earlier, prices increased \$0.462/gallon (17.0%) for heating oil, \$0.466/gallon (14.8%) for kerosene and \$0.361/gallon (13.1%) for propane.

Crude Oil Prices—For the week ending 3/2/18, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$62.07/bbl, a decrease of \$0.40/bbl (0.6%) from the week-ago average of \$62.47/bbl. WTI prices are now \$8.51/bbl (15.9%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$53.56/bbl. The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred on 7/04/08.

Spot Natural Gas Prices—For the week ending 3/2/18, Henry Hub natural gas spot prices averaged \$2.610 per million Btu (mmBtu), an increase of \$0.007/mmBtu (0.3%) from the prior week level of \$2.603/mmBtu. Prices are currently \$0.078/mmBtu (3.1%) above the year-earlier weekly average of \$2.532/mmBtu.



Residential Natural Gas Prices—The NYS average price in December 2017 was \$1.010/therm, a decrease of \$0.247/therm (19.6%) from the November 2017 price of \$1.257/therm, and was \$0.080/therm (8.5%) higher than the year earlier average of \$0.930/therm.

Historic Retail Prices—Statewide average high and low prices since Sept. 1997 for heating oil & propane & Sept. 2000 for kerosene.

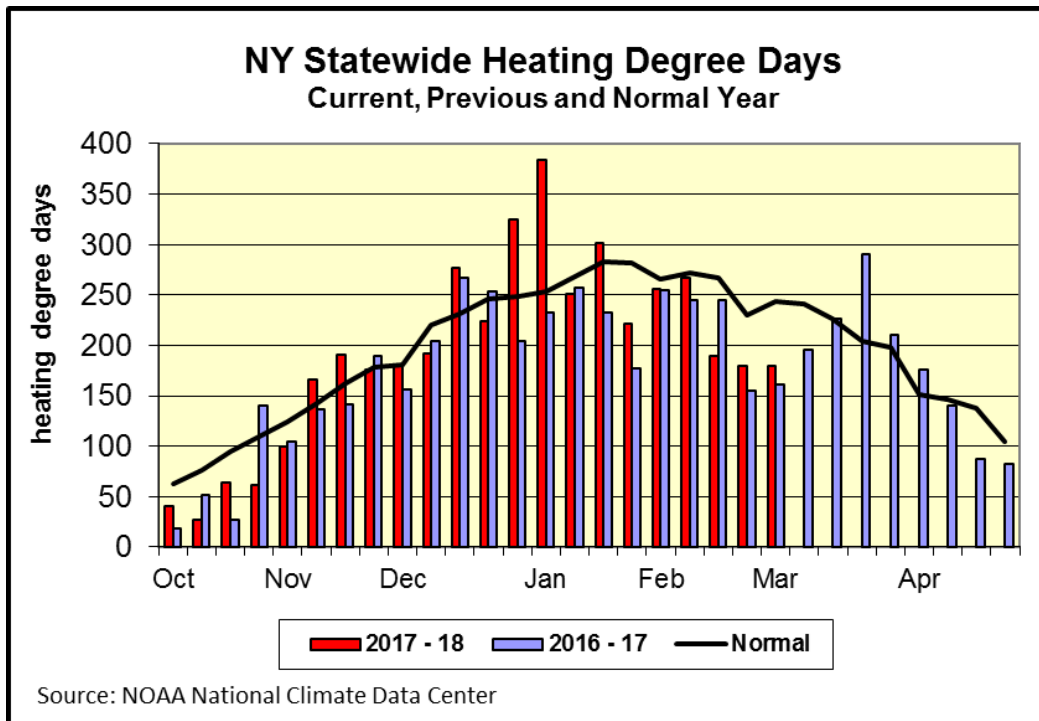
- Heating oil—highest price \$4.778/gallon on 7/14/08, lowest price \$0.876/gallon on 9/08/98.

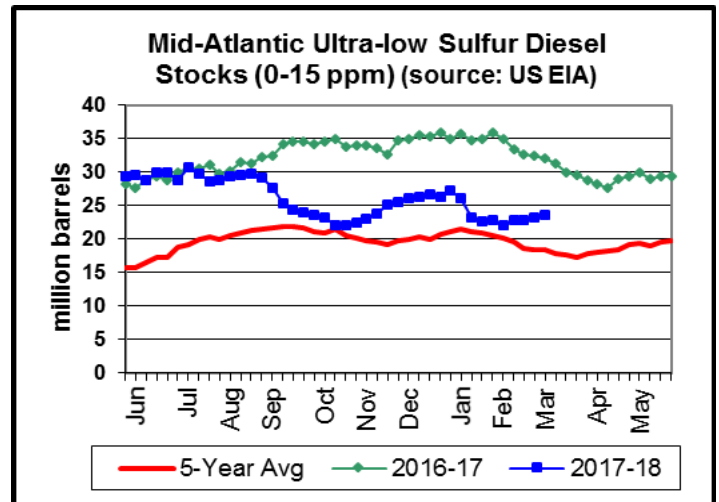
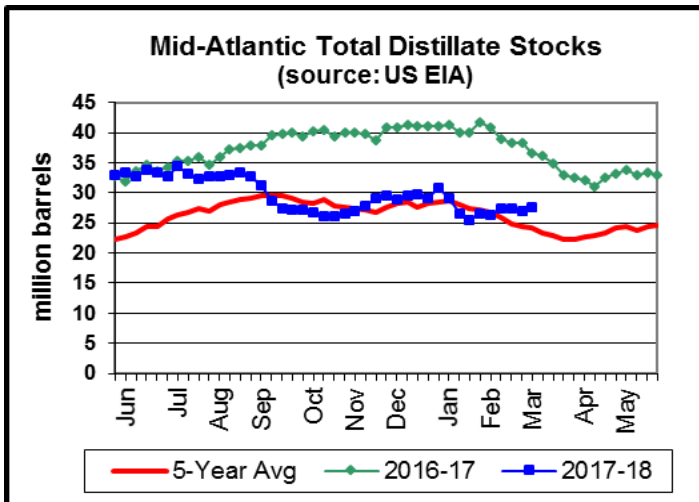

Heating Degree Days— The statewide number of heating degree-days (180) was 11.8% above the year-ago level of (161) and 25.9% below the normal trend (243). On a cumulative basis since October 1st, current season heating degree-days (4,252) are ahead of the year-ago level (3,852) by 10.4% and below the normal trend (4,442) by 4.3%.

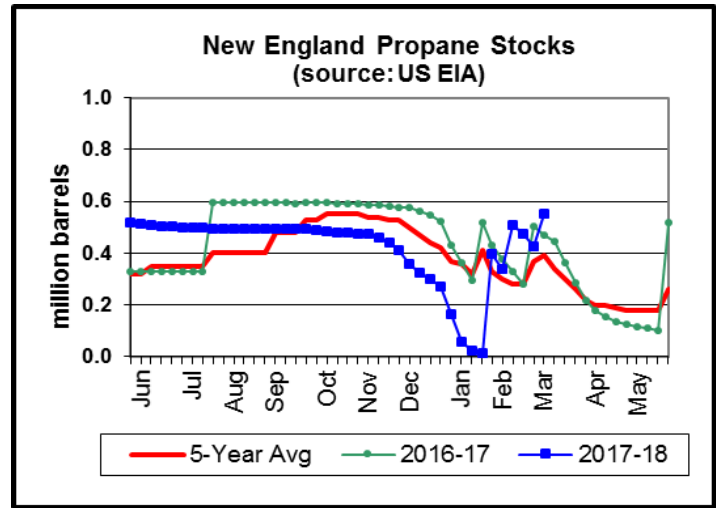
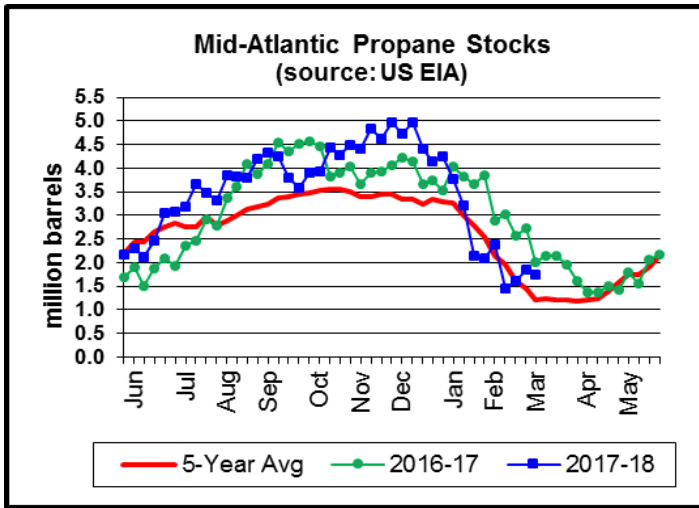

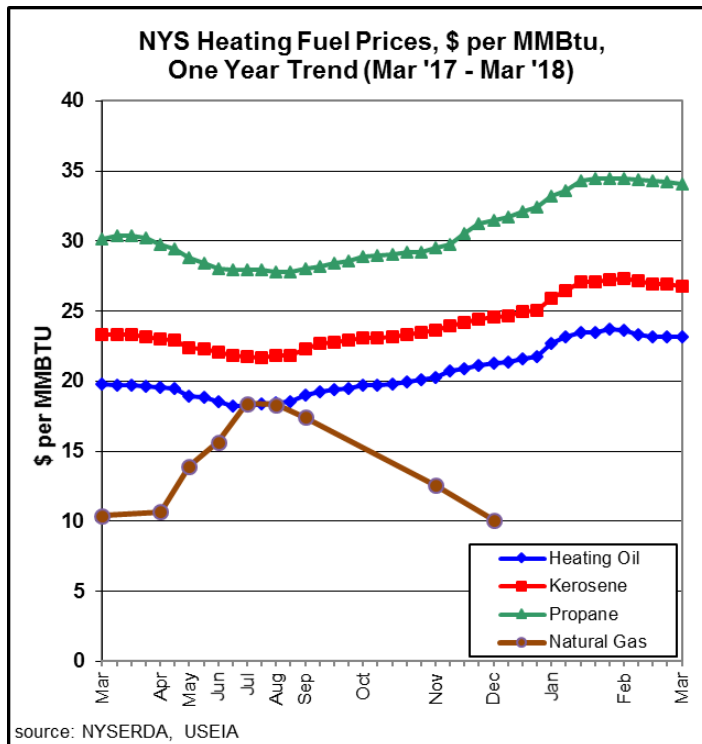

Propane Stocks—Current and historic heating fuel inventory data is presented in the graphs below.

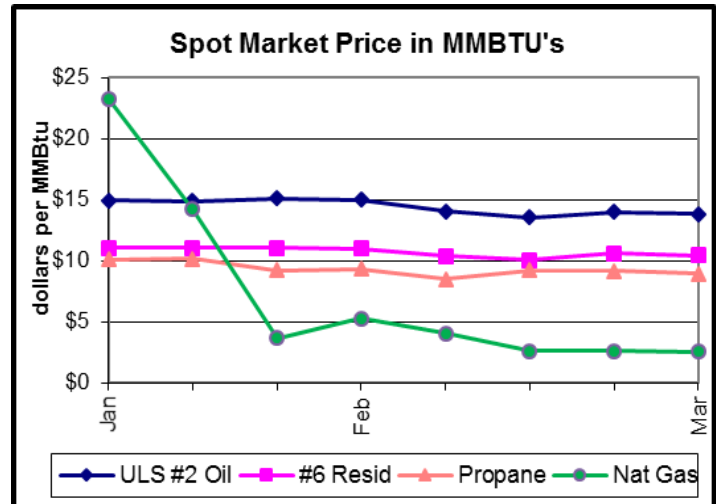


Retail Btu Price Equivalents—The New York State Heating Fuel Prices Btu graph equates the retail price for New York Statewide average residential ultra-low sulfur heating oil, kerosene, propane, and natural gas on a dollar per million Btu (MMBtu) basis.



Note: Natural gas prices are from the U.S. EIA and provided on a monthly basis and delayed by 3 months.

Spot Btu Price Equivalents—The Btu spot market graph equates the spot market price, in table below, for NY Harbor ultra-low sulfur diesel fuel and 0.3% sulfur high pour #6 residual fuel, Mont Belvieu propane, and the New York City gate natural gas price on a dollar per million Btu (MMBtu) basis.
