

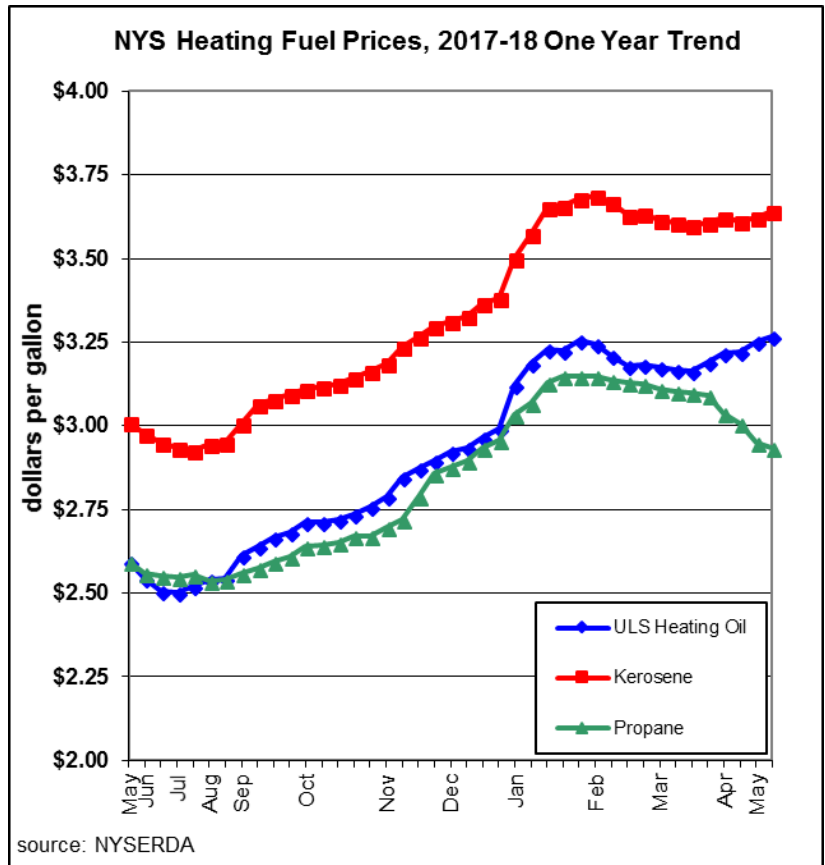
Highlights

- For the first time in seven weeks, the weekly average WTI crude oil spot price decreased by \$0.32/bbl (0.4%) since last week to \$70.98/bbl. Current prices are \$20.77/bbl (41.4%) higher than the year-ago price of \$50.21/bbl.
- Mid-Atlantic ultra-low sulfur (ULS) distillate stocks increased by 0.2 million barrels (1.4%) since last week to 13.5 million barrels but remain 53.9% below last year’s level and 30.6% below the 5-year average.
- New York Statewide average retail prices of ultra-low sulfur (ULS) heating oil and kerosene increased while the average retail price of propane decreased since the last survey.

Retail Petroleum Prices—On a statewide basis since the last survey on May 14th, prices increased \$0.016/gallon (0.5%) to \$3.269/gallon for ULS heating oil and \$0.018/gallon (0.5%) to \$3.641/gallon for kerosene, while the price decreased \$0.018/gallon (0.6%) to \$2.933/gallon for propane. Compared to a year earlier, prices increased \$0.676/gallon (26.1%) for heating oil, \$0.631/gallon (21.0%) for kerosene and \$0.339/gallon (13.1%) for propane.

Crude Oil Prices—For the week ending 5/25/18, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$70.98/bbl, a decrease of \$0.32/bbl (0.4%) from the week-ago average of \$71.30/bbl. WTI prices are now \$20.77/bbl (41.4%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$50.21/bbl. The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred on 7/04/08.

Spot Natural Gas Prices—For the week ending 5/25/18, Henry Hub natural gas spot prices averaged \$2.828 per million Btu (mmBtu), an increase of \$0.046/mmBtu (1.7%) from the prior week level of \$2.782/mmBtu. Prices are currently \$0.308/mmBtu (9.8%) below the year-earlier weekly average of \$3.136/mmBtu.



Residential Natural Gas Prices—The NYS average price in March 2018 was \$1.167/therm, an increase of \$0.084/therm (7.8%) from the February 2018 price of \$1.083/therm, and was \$0.125/therm (12.1%) higher than the year earlier average of \$1.042/therm.

Historic Retail Prices—Statewide average high and low prices since Sept. 1997 for heating oil & propane & Sept. 2000 for kerosene.

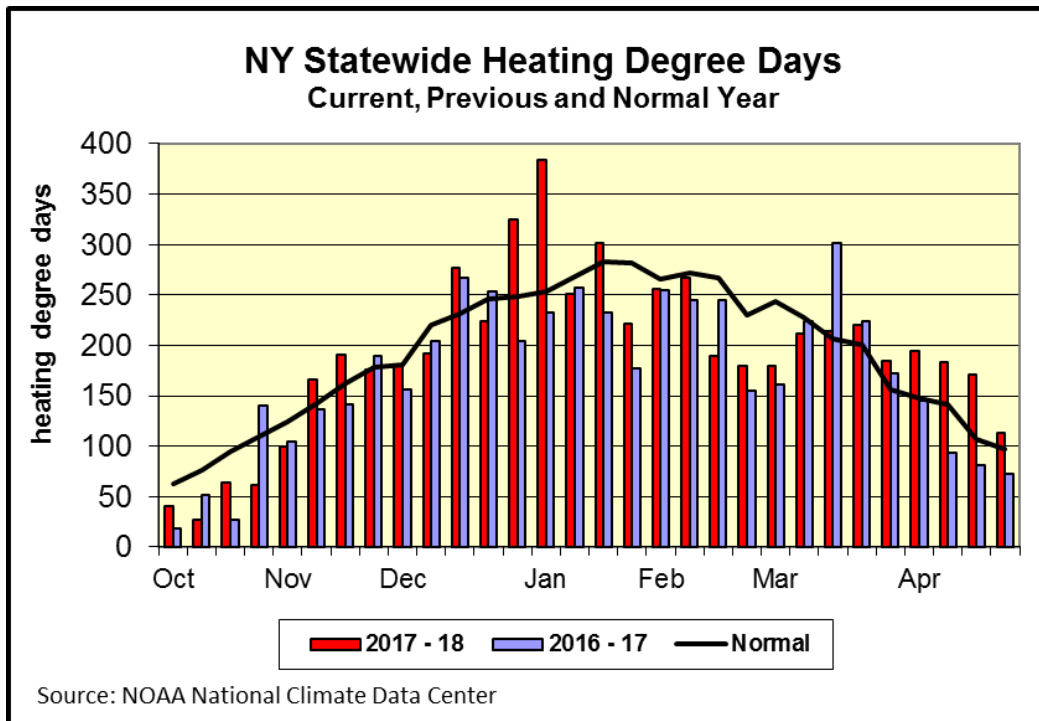
- Heating oil—highest price \$4.778/gallon on 7/14/08, lowest price \$0.876/gallon on 9/08/98.

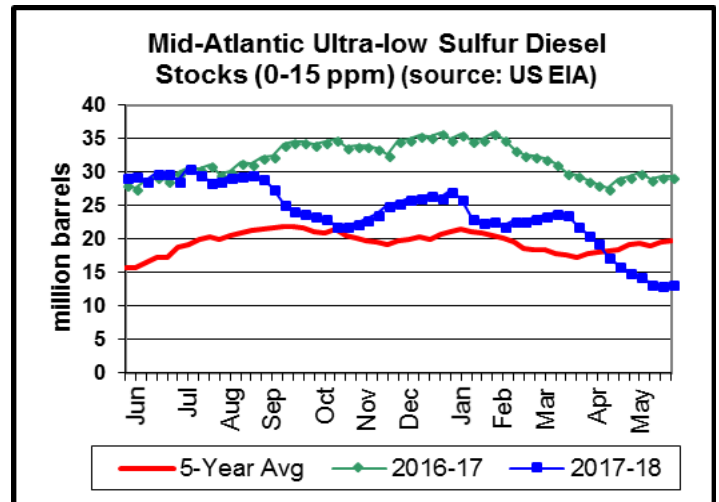
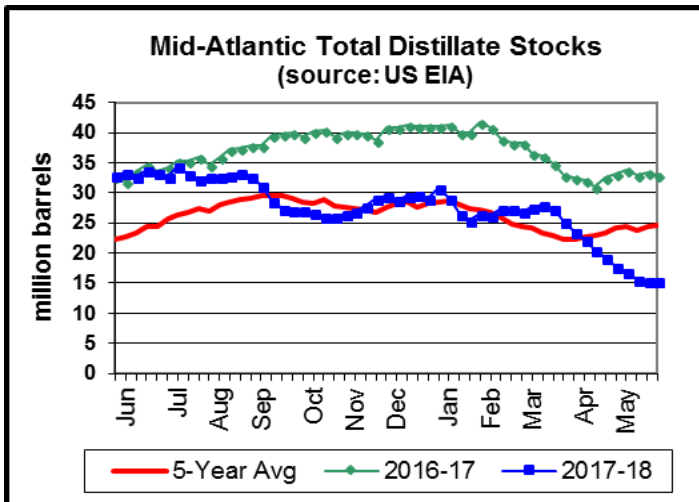

Heating Degree Days— Until the start of the next heating season in October, the heating degree day information below reflects weekly information through April 28, 2018. Cumulative statewide heating degree-days from October 1st through April 28th end the current season at 5,742 which is ahead of the year-ago level (5,166) by 11.1% and ahead of the normal trend (5,726) by 0.3%.

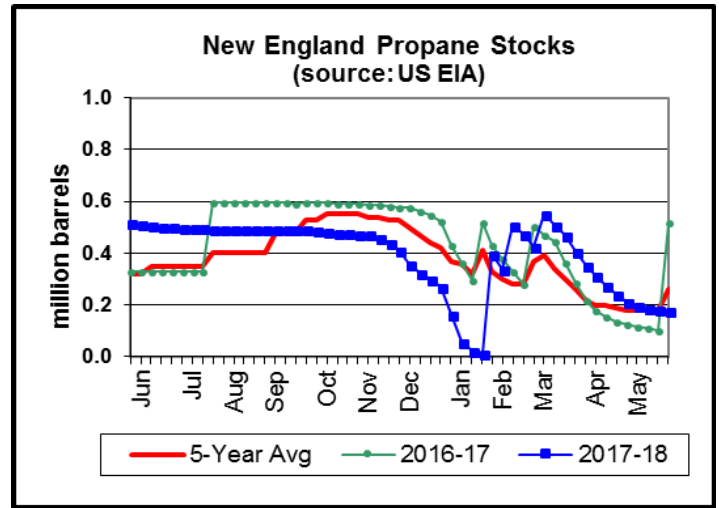
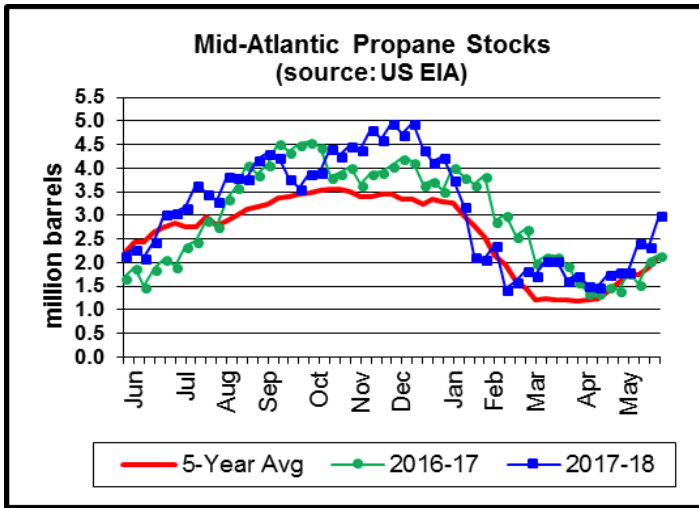

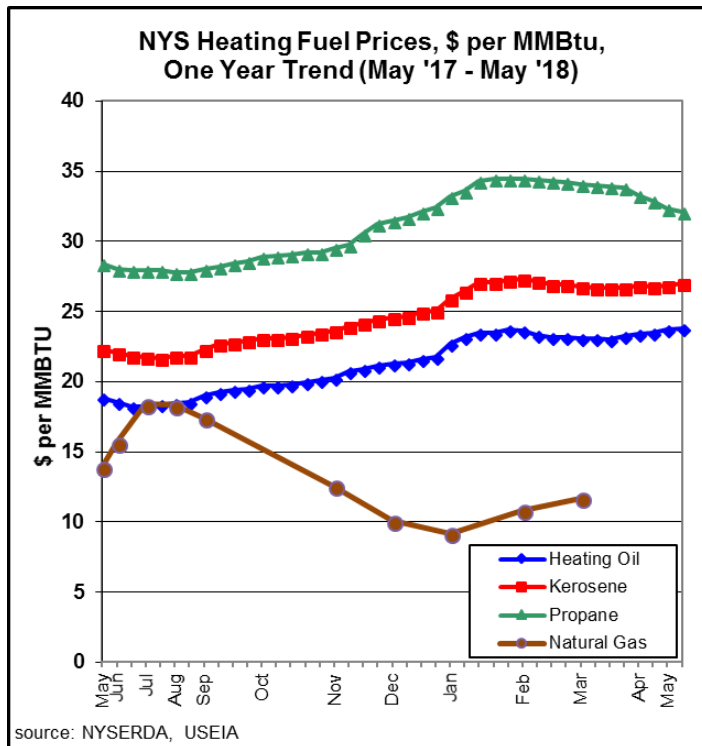

Propane Stocks—Current and historic heating fuel inventory data is presented in the graphs below.

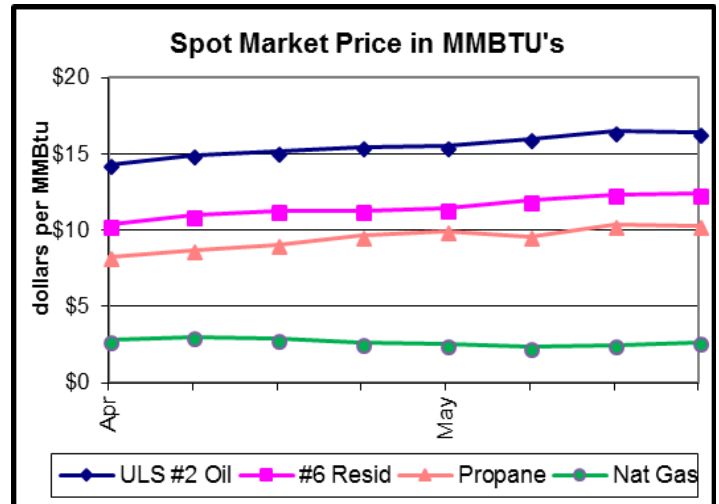


Retail Btu Price Equivalents—The New York State Heating Fuel Prices Btu graph equates the retail price for New York Statewide average residential ultra-low sulfur heating oil, kerosene, propane, and natural gas on a dollar per million Btu (MMBtu) basis.



Note: Natural gas prices are from the U.S. EIA and provided on a monthly basis and delayed by 3 months.

Spot Btu Price Equivalents—The Btu spot market graph equates the spot market price, in table below, for NY Harbor ultra-low sulfur diesel fuel and 0.3% sulfur high pour #6 residual fuel, Mont Belvieu propane, and the New York City gate natural gas price on a dollar per million Btu (MMBtu) basis.
