

Highlights

- The weekly average New York State retail diesel price decreased \$0.029/gallon (0.9%) from last week’s average to \$3.291/gallon and is now \$1.100/gal (25.1%) lower than last year’s weekly average of \$4.391/gallon.
- Mid-Atlantic ULS diesel stocks increased 14.1% from last week to 11.6 million barrels but are 5.3% below last year’s level of 12.2 million barrels.
- The weekly average West Texas Intermediate (WTI) crude oil spot price increased for the third week in a row to \$51.78/bbl, an increase of \$2.87/bbl (5.9%) from last week. WTI is still \$50.94/bbl (49.6%) lower than last year’s weekly average price of \$102.72/bbl.

Retail Prices

Prices are from the “AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report.”

Regular Gasoline— For the week ending April 13th, the New York State weekly retail gasoline price average remained unchanged from last week’s average of \$2.566/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$3.785/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$1.219/gallon (32.2%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

Diesel— For the week ending April 13th, the New York State weekly retail diesel price averaged \$3.291/gallon, a decrease of \$0.029/gallon (0.9%) from last week’s average price of \$3.320/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$4.391/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$1.100/gallon (25.1%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.

Crude Oil Spot Prices




WTI—For the week ending April 10, 2015, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$51.78/bbl, an increase of \$2.87/bbl (5.9%) from the prior week average of \$48.91/bbl. WTI prices are now \$50.94/bbl (49.6%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$102.72/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

Brent—For the week ending April 10, 2015, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$56.51/bbl, an increase of \$1.72/bbl (3.1%) from the week-ago average of \$54.79/bbl. Brent prices are now \$50.00/bbl (46.9%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$106.51/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.




