

Highlights

- The weekly average New York State regular gasoline price increased for the first time since June, increasing by \$0.030/gallon since last week and the current price is now \$2.325/gallon, 12.7% lower than the year-ago price of \$2.665/gallon.
- Weekly U.S. crude oil inventories increased by 2.3 million barrels since last week to 525.9 million barrels and are now 70.5 million barrels (15.5%) higher than last year’s level of 455.4 million barrels.
- Weekly Mid-Atlantic gasoline inventories decreased by 2.2 million barrels (6.2%) since last week to 34.3 million barrels but remain 5.1 million barrels (17.3%) higher than the prior year level of 29.2 million barrels.

Retail Prices

Prices are from the “AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report.”

Regular Gasoline— For the week ending August 29th, 2016 the New York State weekly retail gasoline price averaged \$2.325/gallon, an increase of \$0.030/gallon (1.3%) from last week’s average of \$2.295/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$2.665/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.340/gallon (12.7%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

Diesel— For the week ending August 29th, 2016 the New York State weekly retail diesel price averaged \$2.529/gallon, an increase of \$0.025/gallon (1.0%) from last week’s average price of \$2.504/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$2.989/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.460/gallon (15.4%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.

Crude Oil Spot Prices




WTI—For the week ending August 26th, 2016, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$47.05/bbl, a decrease of \$0.11/bbl (0.2%) from the prior week average of \$47.16/bbl. WTI prices are now \$6.32/bbl (15.5%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$40.73/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

Brent—For the week ending August 26th, 2016, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$48.65/bbl, an increase of \$0.05/bbl (0.1%) from the week-ago average of \$48.60/bbl. Brent prices are now \$5.12/bbl (11.8%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$43.53/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.






