I am deeply concerned for the future of New York State and our country as a whole. Reasons for concern are the direction this state and it's leadership are going and who is really benefiting from these decisions. While much of this is being sold to the public as "green" and "renewable" and "environmentally friendly", the truth of the matter is much of it is not. NYS is a drop in the bucket compared to global carbon emissions and while I agree there are certain human actions that may be contributing to climate change, NYS is far from the leader of those actions. How about the massive amounts of rebar and steel? How much energy goes into producing and transporting those? What about all that non-recyclable fiberglass in the blades that only last 10-15 years? And decompose releasing tons of harmful pollutants into the environment? Or the thousands of endangered birds and bats that wind turbines kill each year? Or the asinine idea of placing wind turbines in Lake Erie, the drinking source for 11 million people in the US AND Canada? That has to be the dumbest idea I've ever heard.
