

# **NEW YORK'S** Green New Deal

Governor Andrew M. Cuomo's Green New Deal is the most aggressive climate change program in the nation and puts the State on a path to economy-wide **carbon-neutrality**.

The recently passed **Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act** mandates several of the Governor's ambitious Green New Deal clean energy targets:

• Significantly increases the Clean Energy Standard goal that New York State's electricity will come from renewables from 50 percent to

 Increases the greenhouse gas emissions reduction goal of 80% from 1990 levels by 2050 to

### 85 percent by 2050

- Quadruples New York's offshore wind target to

- Increases energy storage deployment to
