

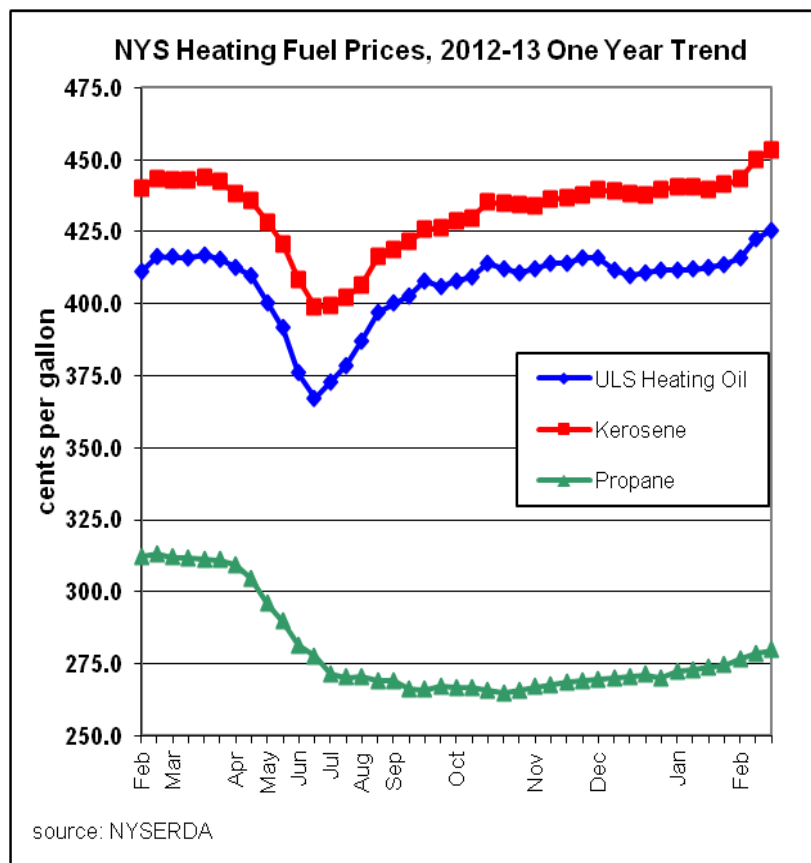
Highlights

- New York statewide average retail prices for ultra-low sulfur (ULS) heating oil, kerosene and propane all increased from the previous period. The statewide average heating oil price increased to a new record for the winter heating season and has not been this high since August 11, 2008.
- Mid-Atlantic and New England propane inventories both continued to experience a large seasonal drawdown from the previous week with Mid-Atlantic propane stocks decreasing by 17.4% and New England stocks declining by 26.5%. Mid-Atlantic propane stocks are 17.4% below the 5-year average.

Retail Petroleum Prices—On a statewide basis since the last survey on February 11th, prices increased 2.8¢/gallon (0.7%) to 425.5¢/gallon for ULS heating oil, 3.2¢/gallon (0.7%) to 453.4¢/gallon for kerosene, and 1.3¢/gallon (0.5%) to 279.8¢/gallon for propane. Compared to a year earlier, prices increased 14.2¢/gallon (3.5%) for heating oil, 13.4¢/gallon (3.0%) for kerosene and decreased 32.4¢/gallon (10.4%) for propane.

Crude Oil Prices—For the week ending 2/15/13, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$96.95/bbl, an increase of \$0.77/bbl (0.8%) from the week-ago average of \$96.18/bbl. WTI prices are now \$4.78/bbl (4.7%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$101.73/bbl. The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred on 7/03/08.

Spot Natural Gas Prices—For the week ending 2/15/13, Henry Hub natural gas spot prices averaged \$3.254 per million Btu (mmBtu), a decrease of \$0.078/mmBtu (2.3%) from the prior week level of \$3.332/mmBtu. Prices are currently \$0.738/mmBtu (29.3%) above the year-earlier weekly average of \$2.516/mmBtu.



Residential Natural Gas Prices—The NYS average price in November 2012 was \$1.123/therm, a decrease of \$0.324/therm (22.4%) from the prior month of \$1.447/therm, and was \$0.239/therm (17.5%) lower than the year earlier average of \$1.362/therm.

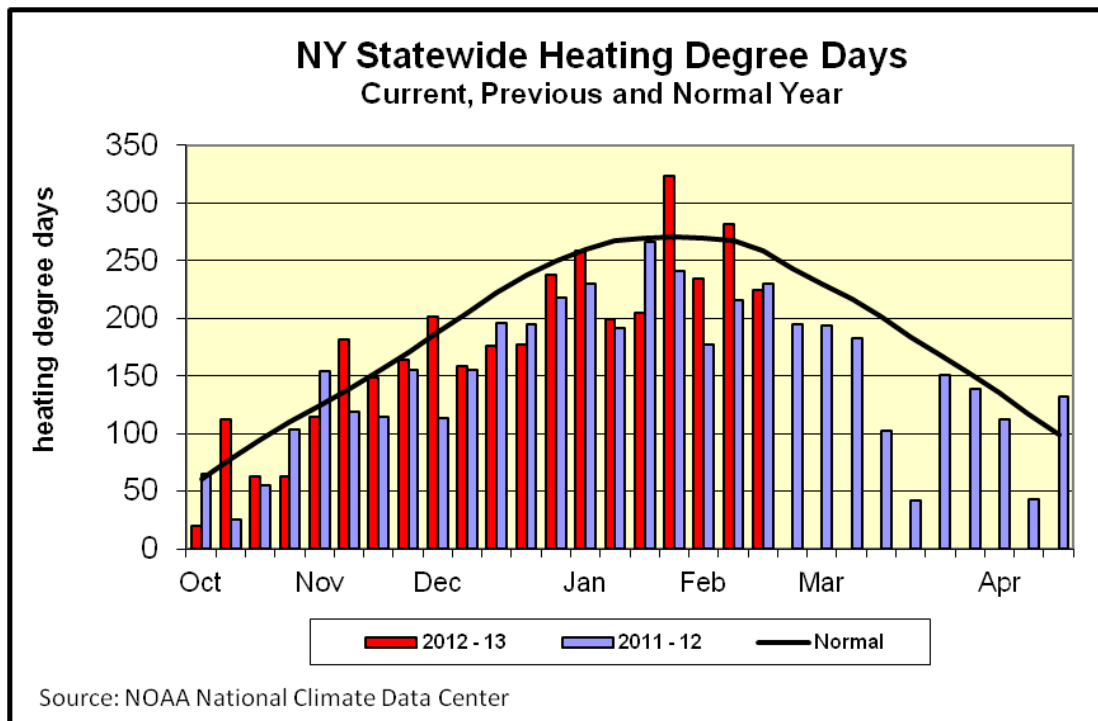
- Heating oil—highest price 477.8¢/gallon on 7/14/08, lowest price 87.6¢/gallon on 9/08/98.

Heating Degree Days—On a statewide basis during the past week, the number of heating degree days (224) was 2.6% below the year-ago level of (230) and 13.2% below the normal trend (258). On a cumulative basis, current year heating degree days (3,542) are ahead of the year-ago level (3,218) by 10.1% and trail the normal trend (3,898) by 9.1%.

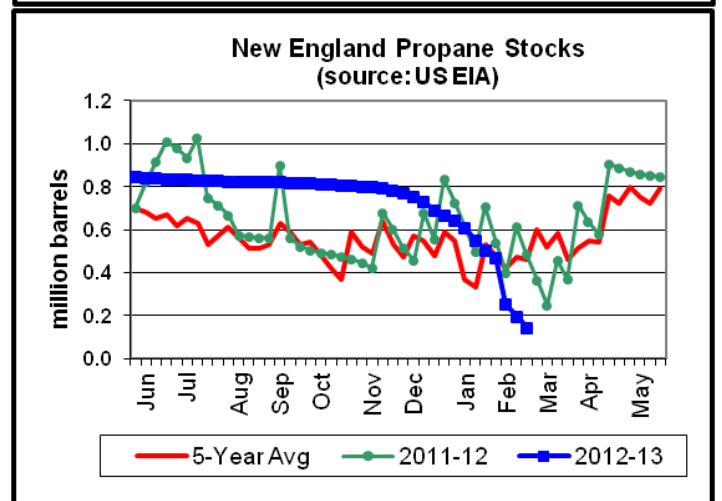
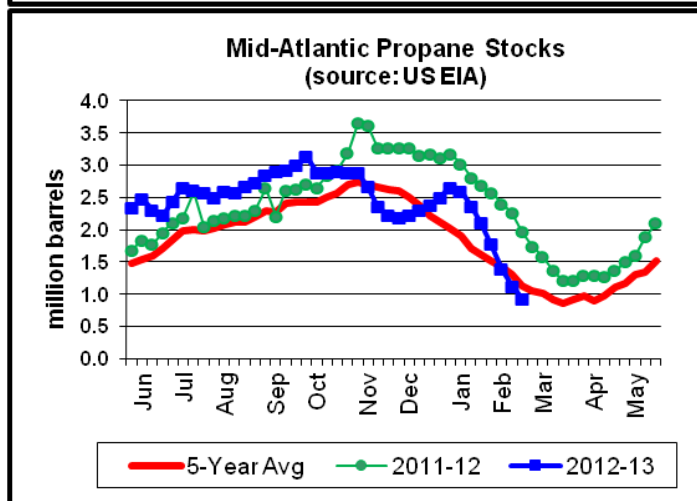
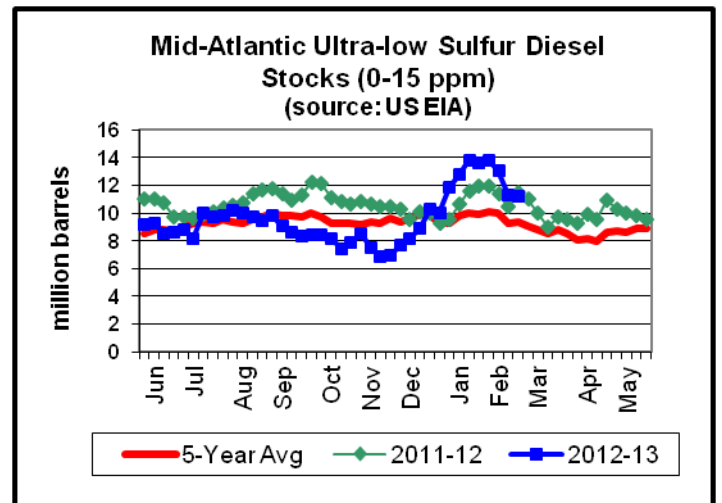
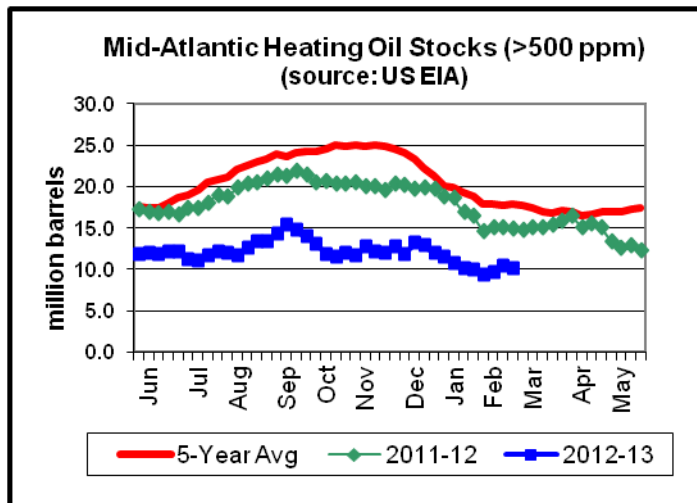
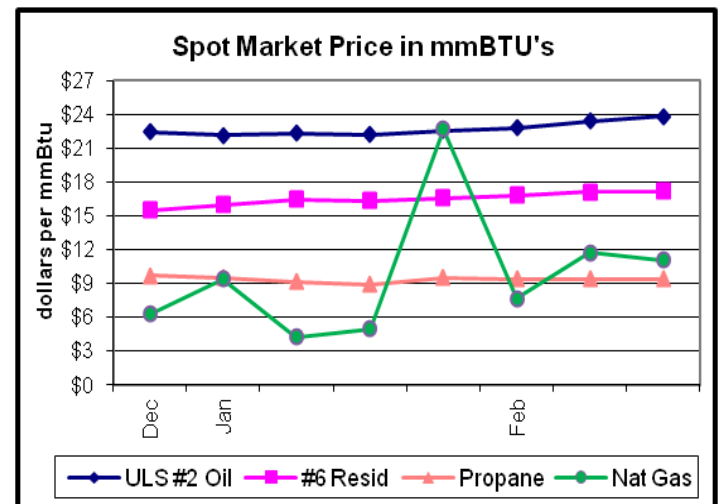
