

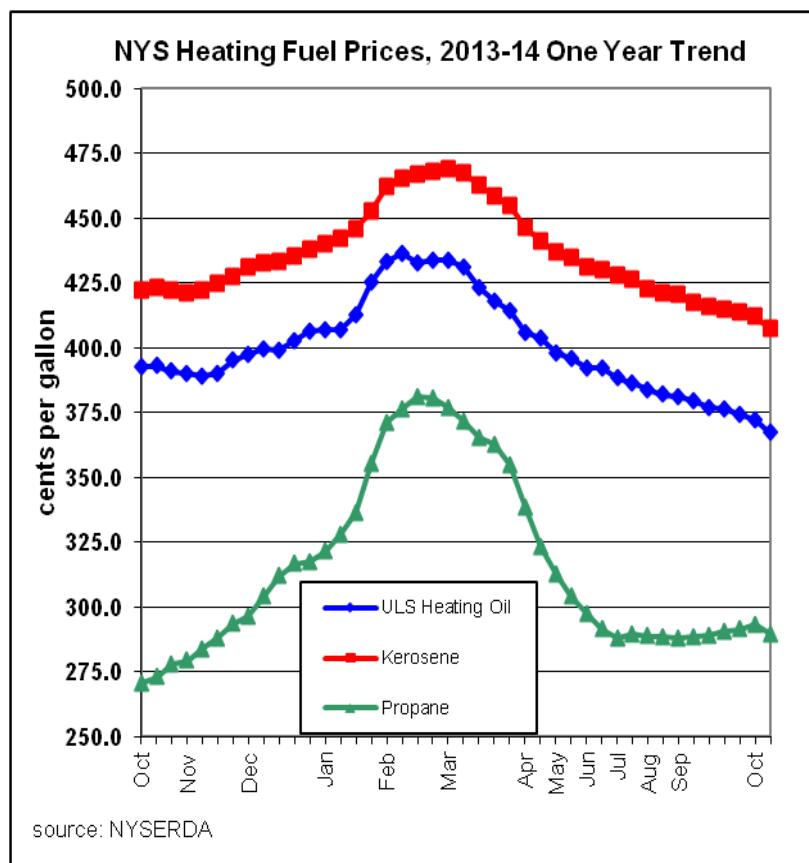
Highlights

- Weekly average U.S. WTI crude oil spot prices decreased to their lowest level since December 2012. The current weekly average U.S. WTI crude oil spot price of \$87.63/barrel is 14.7% lower than last year and 18.3% lower than the 2014 peak price of \$107.23/barrel. Increasing U.S. crude oil production and slowing growth in worldwide demand for crude oil has led to falling crude oil prices.
- New York statewide average retail prices for ultra-low sulfur (ULS) heating oil, kerosene, and propane all decreased since the last survey period.

Retail Petroleum Prices—On a statewide basis since the last survey on October 6th, prices decreased 5.0¢/gallon (1.3%) to 367.3¢/gallon for ULS heating oil, 4.9¢/gallon (1.2%) to 407.3¢/gallon for kerosene, and 3.5¢/gallon (1.2%) to 289.7¢/gallon for propane. Compared to a year earlier, prices decreased 25.6¢/gallon (6.5%) for heating oil and 15.1¢/gallon (3.6%) for kerosene while the price increased 18.8¢/gallon (6.9%) for propane.

Crude Oil Prices—For the week ending 10/10/14, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$87.63/bbl, a decrease of \$3.81/bbl (4.2%) from the week-ago average of \$91.44/bbl. WTI prices are now \$15.07/bbl (14.7%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$102.70/bbl. The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred on 7/03/08.

Spot Natural Gas Prices—For the week ending 10/10/14, Henry Hub natural gas spot prices averaged \$3.870 per million Btu (mmBtu), a decrease of \$0.180/mmBtu (4.4%) from the prior week level of \$4.050/mmBtu. Prices are currently \$0.172/mmBtu (4.7%) above the year-earlier weekly average of \$3.698/mmBtu.



Residential Natural Gas Prices—The NYS average price in July 2014 was \$1.811/therm, an increase of \$0.055/therm (3.2%) from the prior month of \$1.756/therm, and was \$0.096/therm (5.0%) lower than the year earlier average of \$1.907/therm.

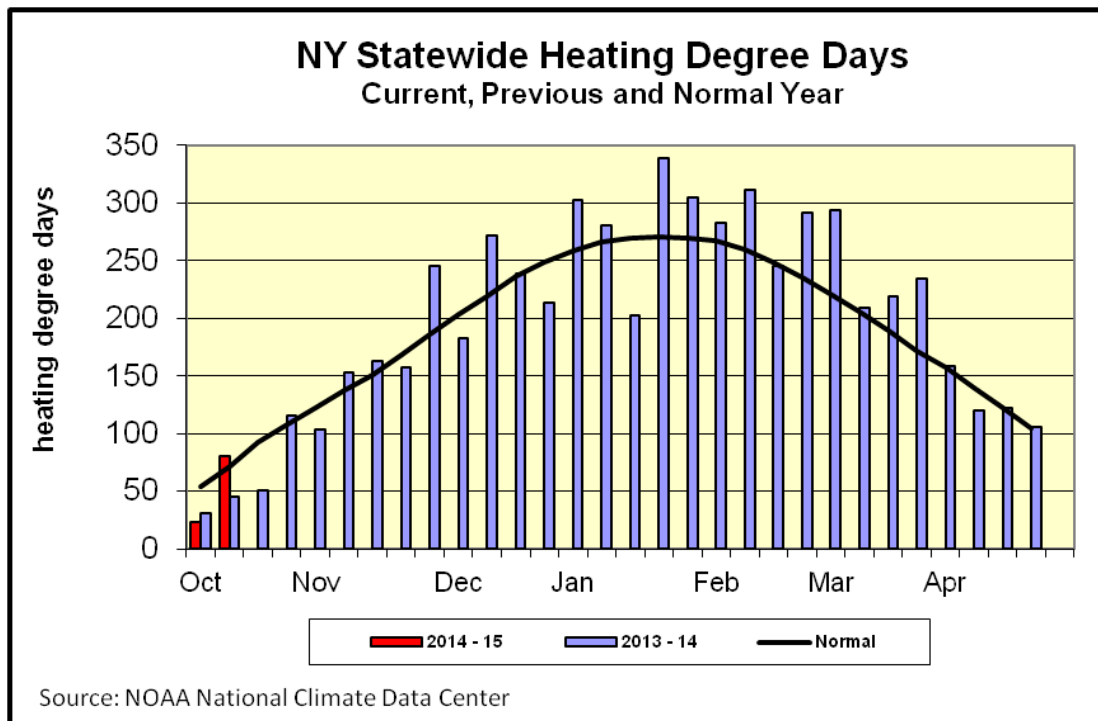

Heating Degree Days—On a statewide basis during the past week, the number of heating degree days (80) was 77.8% above the year-ago level of (45) and 12.7% above the normal trend (71). On a cumulative basis since October 1st, current year heating degree days (103) are ahead of the year-ago level (76) by 35.5% and are behind the normal trend (125) by 17.6%.

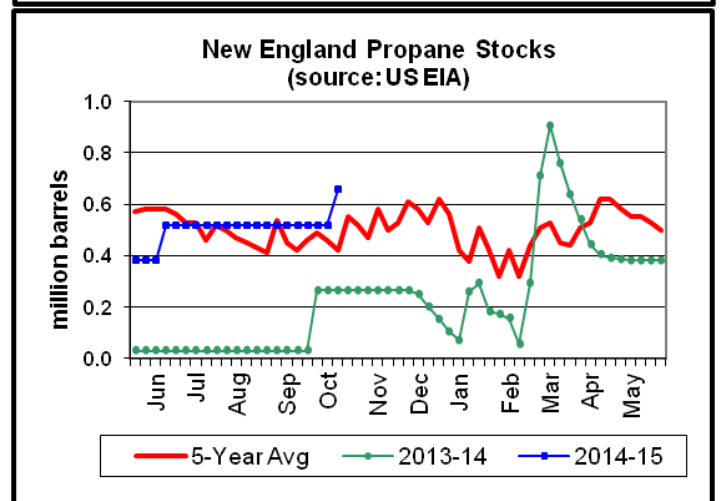
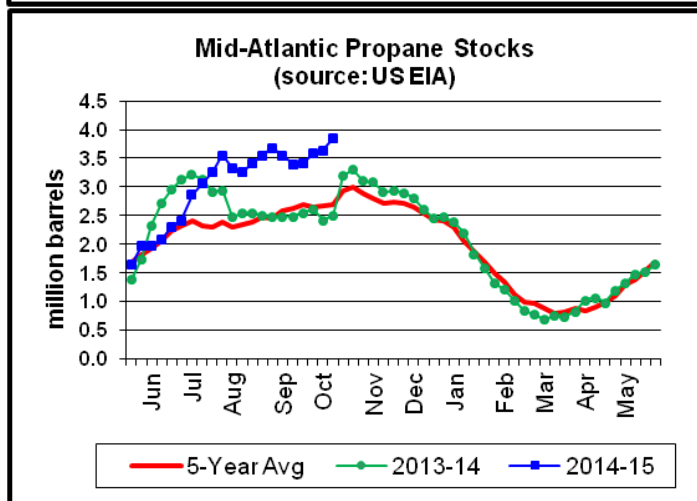
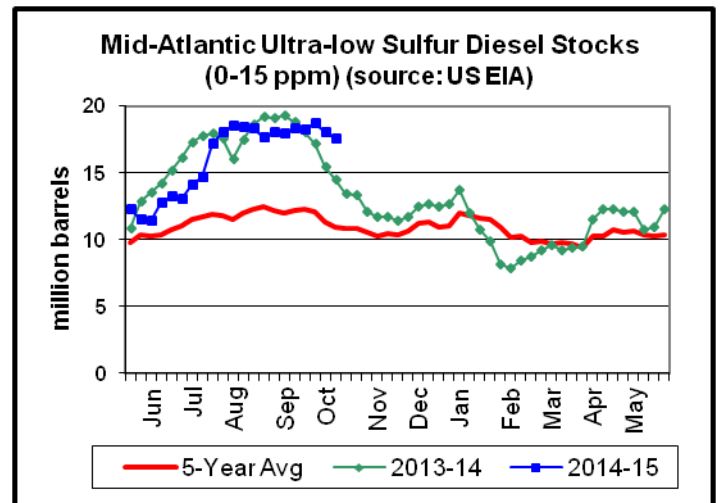
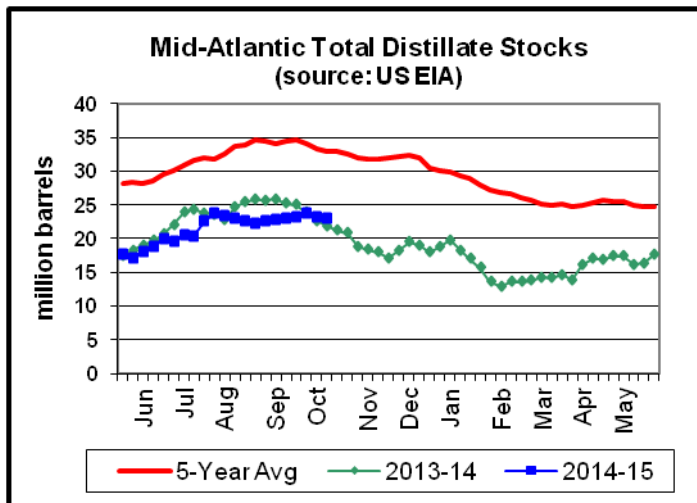
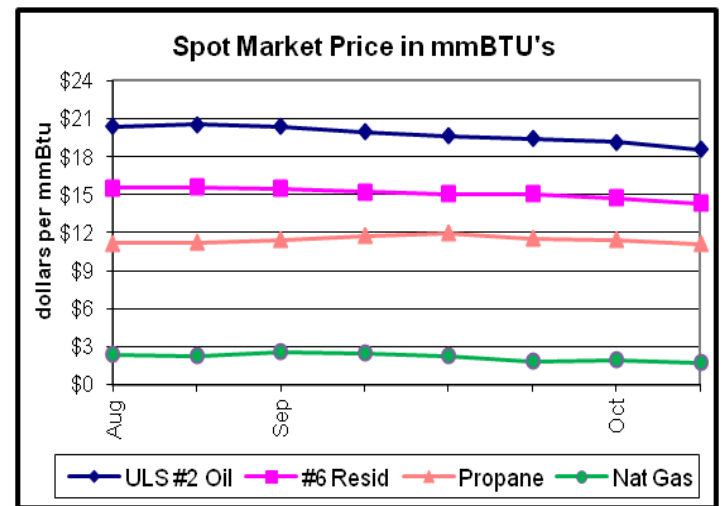
