
Highlights

- U.S. crude oil inventories for the week ending October 30 increased by 2.8 million barrels (0.6%) since the previous week and are now 102.6 million barrels (27.0%) above last year's level.
- Mid-Atlantic ultra-low sulfur diesel stocks decreased by 0.1 million barrels (0.4%) since last week but remain 70.3% above last year's level.
- New York statewide average retail prices for ultra-low sulfur (ULS) heating oil and kerosene decreased while the average propane price increased since the last survey.

Retail Petroleum Prices—On a statewide basis since the last survey on October 26^{th} , prices decreased 0.1ϕ /gallon (0.0%) to 253.2ϕ /gallon for ULS heating oil, 0.4ϕ /gallon (0.1%) to 298.2ϕ /gallon for kerosene, and increased 0.7ϕ /gallon (0.3%) to 221.6ϕ /gallon for propane. Compared to a year earlier, prices decreased 105.0ϕ /gallon (29.3%) for heating oil, 102.3ϕ /gallon (25.5%) for kerosene and 60.0ϕ /gallon (21.3%) for propane.

Crude Oil Prices—For the week ending 10/30/15, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$44.99/bbl, a decrease of \$0.17/bbl (0.4%) from the week-ago average of \$45.16/bbl. WTI prices are now \$36.30/bbl (44.7%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$81.29/bbl. The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred on 7/04/08.

Spot Natural Gas Prices—For the week ending 10/30/15, Henry Hub natural gas spot prices averaged \$2.082 per million Btu (mmBtu), a decrease of \$0.294/mmBtu (12.4%) from the prior week level of \$2.376/mmBtu. Prices are currently \$1.564/mmBtu (42.9%) below the year-earlier weekly average of \$3.646/mmBtu.



Residential Natural Gas Prices—The NYS average price in August 2015 was \$1.691/therm, an increase of \$0.023/therm (1.3%) from the prior month of \$1.668/therm, and was \$0.151/therm (8.2%) lower than the year earlier average of \$1.842/therm.

Historic Retail Prices—Statewide average high and low prices since Sept. 1997 for #2 & propane & Sept. 2000 for kerosene.


- Heating oil—highest price 477.8¢/gallon on 7/14/08, lowest price 87.6¢/gallon on 9/08/98.

Heating Degree Days—On a statewide basis during the past week, the number of heating degree-days (114) was 14.0% above the year-ago level of (100) and 1.7% below the normal trend (116). On a cumulative basis since October 1st, current year heating degree-days (439) are ahead of the year-ago level (341) by 28.7% and are ahead of the normal trend (423) by 3.8%.


