
## **Highlights**

- Mid-Atlantic ultra-low sulfur distillate inventories decreased by 0.9 million barrels (2.4%) to 34.8 million barrels but remain 4.3% above the year-ago level.
- Mid-Atlantic propane inventories decreased by 5.1% since last week and are now 6.1% lower than the year-ago level.
- For the ninth week in a row, New York statewide average retail prices for ultra-low sulfur (ULS) heating oil, kerosene, and propane all increased since the last survey.

**Retail Petroleum Prices**—On a statewide basis since the last survey on January 9<sup>th</sup>, prices increased \$0.002/gallon (0.1%) to \$2.709/gallon for ULS heating oil, \$0.011/gallon (0.4%) to \$3.152/gallon for kerosene, and \$0.021/gallon (0.8%) to \$2.636/gallon for propane. Compared to a year earlier, prices increased \$0.437/gallon (19.2%) for heating oil, \$0.345/gallon (12.3%) for kerosene and \$0.310/gallon (13.3%) for propane.

**Crude Oil Prices**—For the week ending 1/13/17, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$52.07/bbl, a decrease of \$1.35/bbl (2.5%) from the week-ago average of \$53.42/bbl. WTI prices are now \$21.48/bbl (70.2%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$30.59/bbl. The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred on 7/04/08.

**Spot Natural Gas Prices**—For the week ending 1/13/17, Henry Hub natural gas spot prices averaged \$3.260 per million Btu (mmBtu), a decrease of \$0.090/mmBtu (2.7%) from the prior week level of \$3.350/mmBtu. Prices are currently \$0.938/mmBtu (40.4%) above the year-earlier weekly average of \$2.322/mmBtu.



**Residential Natural Gas Prices**—The NYS average price in October 2016 was \$1.437/therm, a decrease of \$0.241/therm (14.4%) from the prior month of \$1.678/therm, and was \$0.057/therm (4.1%) higher than the year earlier average of \$1.380/therm.


- Heating oil—highest price \$4.778/gallon on 7/14/08, lowest price \$0.876/gallon on 9/08/98.




**Heating Degree Days**— On a statewide basis during the past week, the number of heating degree-days (251) was 5.9% above the year-ago level of (237) and 7.0% below the normal trend (270). On a cumulative basis since October 1<sup>st</sup>, current year heating degree-days (2,447) are ahead of the year-ago level (2,202) by 11.1% and behind the normal trend (2,676) by 8.6%.











**Retail Btu Price Equivalents**—The New York State Heating Fuel Prices Btu graph equates the retail price for New York Statewide average residential ultra-low sulfur heating oil, kerosene, propane, and natural gas on a dollar per million Btu (MMBtu) basis.
