
Highlights

- Mid-Atlantic propane inventories for the current week increased by 0.3 million barrels (7.2%) since last week and are now 22.4% above last year's level and 44.2% above the 5-year average.
- Mid-Atlantic ultra-low sulfur (ULS) distillate stocks for the current week increased by 0.4 million barrels (1.4%) since last week and are now 26.5% below last year's level but 29.2% above the 5-year average.
- New York statewide average retail prices of ultra-low sulfur (ULS) heating oil, kerosene, and propane all increased since the last survey.

Retail Petroleum Prices—On a statewide basis since the last survey on November 20th, prices increased \$0.024/gallon (0.8%) to \$2.898/gallon for ULS heating oil, \$0.028/gallon (0.9%) to \$3.297/gallon for kerosene, and \$0.066/gallon (2.4%) to \$2.856/gallon for propane. Compared to a year earlier, prices increased \$0.408/gallon (16.4%) for heating oil, \$0.390/gallon (13.4%) for kerosene and \$0.469/gallon (19.6%) for propane.

Crude Oil Prices—For the week ending 11/24/17, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$57.47/bbl, an increase of \$1.66/bbl (3.0%) from the week-ago average of \$55.81/bbl. WTI prices are now \$10.22/bbl (21.6%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$47.25/bbl. The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred on 7/04/08.

Spot Natural Gas Prices—For the week ending 11/24/17, Henry Hub natural gas spot prices averaged \$2.995 per million Btu (mmBtu), a decrease of \$0.093/mmBtu (3.0%) from the prior week level of \$3.088/mmBtu. Prices are currently \$0.195/mmBtu (7.0%) above the year-earlier weekly average of \$2.800/mmBtu.



Residential Natural Gas Prices—The NYS average price in August 2017 was \$1.831/therm, a decrease of \$0.009/therm (0.5%) from the prior month of \$1.840/therm, and was \$0.103/therm (5.9%) higher than the year earlier average of \$1.728/therm.

Historic Retail Prices—Statewide average high and low prices since Sept. 1997 for heating oil & propane & Sept. 2000 for kerosene.






Heating Degree Days— On a statewide basis during the past week, the number of heating degree-days (176) was 7.4% below the year-ago level of (190) and 1.1% below the normal trend (178). On a cumulative basis since October 1st, current year heating degree-days (825) are ahead of the year-ago level (808) by 2.1% and behind the normal trend (950) by 13.2%.









Propane Stocks—Current and historic heating fuel inventory data is presented in the graphs below.




