NYSERDA Transportation Fuels Report

Highlights

- In the past week, the New York State average-weekly retail gasoline were \$3.811/gallon, up 2.3% from the prior week and 1.1% from the year-ago price. Diesel prices were \$4.334/gallon, up 0.4% from the prior week and 2.7% from the year-ago price.
- Regionally, Syracuse had the lowest gasoline price in the State, at \$3.740/gallon while New York City had the highest at \$3.895/gallon.
- Mid-Atlantic gasoline inventories continue to be replenished in their seasonal climb and were up 11.7% from the prior week to 32.4 million barrels. Stocks are now 0.9% and 3.7% below the year-ago and five-year average levels, respectively.

Retail Prices

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

Regular Gasoline— As of February 6, 2013, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average regular gasoline price equaled \$3.898/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$3.777/gallon, the statewide average has increased \$0.121/gallon (3.2%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

Diesel— As of February 6, 2013, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average diesel price equaled \$4.357/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$4.218/gallon, the statewide average has increased \$0.139/gallon (3.3%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.


WTI—For the week ending February 1, 2013, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$97.33/bbl, an increase of \$1.92/bbl (2.0%) from the prior week average of \$95.41/bbl. WTI prices are now \$0.47/bbl (0.5%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$97.80/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

Brent—For the week ending February 1, 2013,

Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$115.03/bbl, an increase of \$1.31/bbl (1.2%) from the week-ago average of \$113.72/bbl. Brent prices are now \$3.83/bbl (3.5%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$111.20/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.




