Highlights

- In the past week, the New York State average-weekly retail gasoline price was \$4.004 /gallon, up 1.2% from the prior week and 2.4% from the year-ago price. Diesel prices were \$4.418/gallon, up 0.7% from the prior week and 2.3% from the year-ago price.
- New York State average gasoline prices are up \$0.273/gallon since January 1, 2013, a 7.3% rise.
- Mid-Atlantic highway diesel inventories fell 11.9% to 9.8 million barrels; 10.6% below the year-ago level but 6.3% above the five-year average.

Retail Prices

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

Regular Gasoline— As of February 27, 2013, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average regular gasoline price equaled \$4.013/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$3.950/gallon, the statewide average has increased \$0.063/gallon (1.6%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

Diesel— As of February 27, 2013, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average diesel price equaled \$4.427/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$4.347/gallon, the statewide average has increased \$0.08/gallon (1.8%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.





WTI—For the week ending February 22, 2013, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$94.38/bbl, a decrease of \$2.57/bbl (2.7%) from the prior week average of \$96.95/bbl. WTI prices are now \$12.8/bbl (12.6%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$107.18/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

Brent—For the week ending February 22, 2013, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$115.30/bbl, a





decrease of \$2.80/bbl (2.4%) from the week-ago average of \$118.10/bbl. Brent prices are now \$8.04/bbl (6.7%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$123.34/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.
