Highlights

- In the past week, the New York State average-weekly retail gasoline price was \$4.002/gallon, down 0.2¢/gallon (0.0%) from the prior week but up 2.6¢/gallon (0.7%) from the year-ago price. Diesel was \$4.422/gallon, up 0.4¢/gallon (0.1%) from the prior week and 5.1¢/gallon (1.2%) above the year-ago price.
- Crude oil prices continued to decline this week; WTI and Brent are down 14.3% and 10.1% from the prior year, respectively.
- For the week ending March 1, 2013, U.S. gasoline demand fell 2.7% from the prior week to 8.4 million barrels per day last week. This is 1.2% below the year-ago demand and 6.3% below the five-year average.

Retail Prices

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

Regular Gasoline— As of March 6, 2013, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average regular gasoline price equaled \$3.980/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$3.992/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.012/gallon (0.3%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th. 2008.

Diesel— As of March 6, 2013, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average diesel price equaled \$4.411/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$4.380/gallon, the statewide average has

increased \$0.031/gallon (0.7%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.



WTI—For the week ending March 1, 2013, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$92.19/bbl, a decrease of \$2.19/bbl (2.3%) from the prior week average of \$94.38/bbl. WTI prices are now \$15.33/bbl (14.3%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$107.52/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

Brent—For the week ending March 1, 2013, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$112.42/bbl, a



decrease of \$2.88/bbl (2.5%) from the week-ago average of \$115.30/bbl. Brent prices are now \$12.46/bbl (10.1%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$124.88/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.
