Highlights

- In the past week, the New York State average-weekly retail gasoline price was \$3.907/gallon, down 2.4¢/gallon (0.6%) from the prior week and down 16.5¢/gallon (4.1%) from the year-ago price. Diesel was \$4.355/gallon, down 2.2¢/gallon (0.5%) from the prior week and down 6.7¢/gallon (1.5%) from the year-ago price.
- The differential in crude oil prices between benchmark WTI and Brent continued to decline this week, narrowing to \$11.60/barrel; WTI and Brent prices are down 8.6% and 13.5% from the prior year, respectively.
- Total U.S. gasoline demand was 8.5 million barrels per day; up 1.5% from the prior week, down 3.0% from a year ago, and 5.6% below the five-year average.

Retail Prices

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

Regular Gasoline— As of April 3, 2013, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average regular gasoline price equaled \$3.892/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$4.085/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.193/gallon (4.7%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

Diesel— As of April 3, 2013, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average diesel price equaled \$4.348/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$4.411/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.063/gallon (1.4%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.





WTI—For the week ending March 29, 2013, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$96.08/bbl, an increase of \$3.03/bbl (3.3%) from the prior week average of \$93.05/bbl. WTI prices are now \$9.04/bbl (8.5%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$105.12/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

Brent—For the week ending March 29, 2013, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$107.68/bbl, an





increase of \$0.25/bbl (0.2%) from the week-ago average of \$107.43/bbl. Brent prices are now \$16.75/bbl (13.5%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$124.43/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.
