Highlights

- In the past week, the New York State average-weekly retail gasoline price was \$3.769/gallon, down 5.5¢/gallon (1.4%) from the prior week and down 37.3¢/gallon (9.0%) from the year-ago price. Diesel was \$4.266/gallon, down 4.2¢/gallon (1.0%) from the prior week and down 16.6¢/gallon (3.7%) from the year-ago price.
- Crude oil prices continue to decline. WTI and Brent are down 14.7% and 16.3% from last year, respectively.
- Mid-Atlantic gasoline inventories are well supplied; up 9.0% from last year and 8.2% above the five-year average.

Retail Prices

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

Regular Gasoline— As of April 24, 2013, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average regular gasoline price equaled \$3.739/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$4.125/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.386/gallon (9.4%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

Diesel— As of April 24, 2013, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average diesel price equaled \$4.238/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$4.424/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.186/gallon (4.2%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.





WTI—For the week ending April 19, 2013, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$88.00/bbl, a decrease of \$5.36/bbl (5.7%) from the prior week average of \$93.36/bbl. WTI prices are now \$15.15/bbl (14.7%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$103.15/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

Brent—For the week ending April 19, 2013, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$98.09/bbl, a decrease of \$5.16/bbl (5.0%) from the week-ago average of \$103.25/bbl. Brent prices are now





\$19.09/bbl (16.3%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$117.18/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.
