Highlights

- In the past week, the New York State average-weekly retail gasoline price was \$3.733/gallon, up 1.7¢/gallon (0.4%) from the prior week and down 23.1¢/gallon (5.8%) from the year-ago price. Diesel was \$4.189/gallon, down 0.7¢/gallon (0.2%) from the prior week and down 14.3¢/gallon (3.3%) from the year-ago price.
- Mid-Atlantic gasoline inventories continue to be well supplied; up 30.1% from last year and 18.7% above the five-year average.
- Consistent with seasonal patterns, U.S. gasoline demand and production both climbed this past week from the prior week, up 5.4% and 3.2%, respectively.

Retail Prices

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

Regular Gasoline— As of May 22, 2013, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average regular gasoline price equaled \$3.752/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$3.940/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.188/gallon (4.8%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th. 2008.

Diesel— As of May 22, 2013, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average diesel price equaled \$4.190/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$4.314/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.124/gallon (2.9%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.





WTI—For the week ending May 17, 2013, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$94.65/bbl, a decrease of \$1.19/bbl (1.2%) from the prior week average of \$95.84/bbl. WTI prices are now \$1.54/bbl (1.7%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$93.11/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

Brent—For the week ending May 17, 2013, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$102.91/bbl, a





decrease of \$0.86/bbl (0.8%) from the week-ago average of \$103.77/bbl. Brent prices are now \$6.96/bbl (6.3%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$109.87/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.
