## NYSERDA Transportation Fuels Report

## **Highlights**

- In the past week, the New York State average-weekly retail gasoline price was \$3.744/gallon, up 0.1¢/gallon (0.0%) from the prior week and up 0.8¢/gallon (0.2%) from the year-ago price.
- Diesel was \$4.167/gallon, down 0.8¢/gallon (0.2%) from the prior week and up 2.8¢/gallon (0.7%) from the yearago price.
- Mid-Atlantic gasoline inventories are 31.0% above last year and 20.0% above the five-year average.
- Mid-Atlantic ULSD inventories remain well supplied; up 5.1% from last week and 65.2% above last year.

## **Retail Prices**

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

**Regular Gasoline**— As of June 19, 2013, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average regular gasoline price equaled \$3.749/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$3.703/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.046/gallon (1.2%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

**Diesel**— As of June 19, 2013, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average diesel price equaled \$4.173/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$4.113/gallon, the statewide average has increased \$0.06/gallon (1.5%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.


## **Crude Oil Spot Prices**

WTI—For the week ending June 14, 2013, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$96.36/bbl, an increase of \$2.11/bbl (2.2%) from the prior week average of \$94.25/bbl. WTI prices are now \$13.09/bbl (15.7%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$83.27/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

**Brent**—For the week ending June 14, 2013, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$103.39/bbl, an



increase of \$0.47/bbl (0.5%) from the week-ago average of \$102.92/bbl. Brent prices are now \$6.18/bbl (6.4%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$97.21/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.




