## NYSERDA Transportation Fuels Report

## **Highlights**

- In the past week, the New York State average-weekly retail gasoline price was \$3.748/gallon, up 0.4¢/gallon (0.1%) from the prior week and up 7.1¢/gallon (1.9%) from the year-ago price.
- Diesel was \$4.168/gallon, up 0.1¢/gallon (0.0%) from the prior week and up 7.8¢/gallon (1.9%) from the year-ago price.
- Mid-Atlantic gasoline inventories are 34.4% above last year and 23.3% above the five-year average.
- Mid-Atlantic ULSD inventories remain well supplied; up 7.0% from last week and 72.4% above last year.

## **Retail Prices**

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

**Regular Gasoline**— As of June 26, 2013, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average regular gasoline price equaled \$3.738/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$3.643/gallon, the statewide average has increased \$0.095/gallon (2.6%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

**Diesel**— As of June 26, 2013, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average diesel price equaled \$4.167/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$4.067/gallon, the statewide average has increased \$0.106/gallon (2.6%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.

## **Crude Oil Spot Prices**


WTI—For the week ending June 21, 2013, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$96.65/bbl, an increase of \$0.29/bbl (0.3%) from the prior week average of \$96.36/bbl. WTI prices are now \$15.54/bbl (19.2%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$81.11/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

**Brent**—For the week ending June 21, 2013, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$103.93/bbl, an increase of \$0.54/bbl (0.5%) from the week-ago

average of \$103.39/bbl. Brent prices are now \$11.47/bbl (12.4%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$92.46/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.




