## **Highlights**

- In the past week, the New York State average-weekly retail gasoline price equaled \$3.633/gallon, down 1.0¢/gallon (0.3%) from the prior week and down 17.6¢/gallon (4.6%) from the year-ago price.
- Diesel was \$4.318/gallon, up 10.6¢/gallon (2.5%) from the prior week and down 1.6¢/gallon (0.4%) from the year-ago price.
- Mid-Atlantic highway diesel inventories decreased 17.6% from the prior week and stocks are 37.4% below yearago levels. Demand for ULS distillate for home heating due to persistent cold weather is contributing to this decline.

## **Retail Prices**

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

**Regular Gasoline**— As of February 5, 2014, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average regular gasoline price equaled \$3.626/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$3.886/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.260/gallon (6.7%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

**Diesel**— As of February 5, 2014, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average diesel price equaled \$4.392/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$4.346/gallon, the statewide average has increased \$0.046/gallon (1.1%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.


## **Crude Oil Spot Prices**



WTI—For the week ending January 31, 2014, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$97.29/bbl, an increase of \$1.10/bbl (1.1%) from the prior week average of \$96.19/bbl. WTI prices are now \$0.04/bbl (0.0%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$97.33/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

**Brent**—For the week ending January 31, 2014, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$108.83/bbl, a decrease of \$0.31/bbl (0.3%) from the week-ago average of \$109.14/bbl. Brent prices are now \$6.30/bbl (5.5%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$115.13/bbl.





The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.
