Highlights

- In the past week, the New York State average-weekly retail gasoline price equaled \$3.625/gallon, down 0.8¢/gallon (0.2%) from the prior week and down 28.8¢/gallon (7.3%) from the year-ago price.
- Diesel was \$4.414/gallon, up 9.2¢/gallon (2.1%) from the prior week and up 5.3¢/gallon (1.2%) from the year-ago price.
- Mid-Atlantic highway diesel inventories decreased 4.1% from the prior week and stocks are 30.9% below yearago levels. Demand for ULS distillate for home heating due to persistent cold weather is contributing to this decline.

Retail Prices

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

Regular Gasoline— As of February 12, 2014, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average regular gasoline price equaled \$3.639/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$3.937/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.298/gallon (7.6%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

Diesel— As of February 12, 2014, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average diesel price equaled \$4.457/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$4.371/gallon, the statewide average has increased \$0.086/gallon (2.0%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.





WTI—For the week ending February 7, 2014, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$97.78/bbl, an increase of \$0.49/bbl (0.5%) from the prior week average of \$97.29/bbl. WTI prices are now \$1.60/bbl (1.7%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$96.18/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

Brent—For the week ending February 7, 2014, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$107.73/bbl, a decrease of \$1.10/bbl (1.0%) from the week-ago average of \$108.83/bbl. Brent prices are now \$9.42/bbl (8.0%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$117.15/bbl.
