## **Highlights**

- In the past week, the New York State average weekly retail gasoline price equaled \$3.772/gallon, the same price as the prior week and down 15.9¢/gallon (4.1%) from the year-ago price.
- The New York State average weekly retail diesel price was \$4.437/gallon, down 2.0¢/gallon (0.5%) from the prior week and up 6.0¢/gallon (1.4%) from the year-ago price.
- East Coast ethanol inventories increased 5.2% in the past week but are down 21.5% from the prior year. As a percentage of East Coast gasoline inventory, ethanol stocks were 8.3% as compared to 10.2% a year ago.

## **Retail Prices**

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

**Regular Gasoline**— As of March 26, 2014, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average regular gasoline price equaled \$3.772/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$3.918/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.146/gallon (3.7%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

**Diesel**— As of March 26, 2014, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average diesel price equaled \$4.429/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$4.365/gallon, the statewide average has increased \$0.064/gallon (1.5%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.


## **Crude Oil Spot Prices**



WTI—For the week ending March 21, 2014, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$99.77/bbl, an increase of \$0.22/bbl (0.2%) from the prior week average of \$99.55/bbl. WTI prices are now \$6.72/bbl (7.2%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$93.05/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

**Brent**—For the week ending March 21, 2014, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$106.53/bbl, a decrease of \$1.48/bbl (1.4%) from the week-ago average of \$108.01/bbl. Brent prices are now \$0.80/bbl (0.7%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$107.33/bbl.





The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.


