## **Highlights**

- In the past week, the New York State average weekly retail gasoline price equaled \$3.893/gallon, down 1.7¢/gallon (0.4%) from the prior week and 16.0¢/gallon (4.3%) higher than the year-ago price.
- The New York State average weekly retail diesel price was \$4.318/gallon, down 1.6¢/gallon (0.4%) from the prior week and up 13.0¢/gallon (3.1%) from the year-ago price.
- U.S. WTI crude oil stocks decreased by 7.2 million barrels (1.8%) to 391.3 million barrels and are now 0.8% below last year's level of 394.6 million barrels but remain 4.1% above the 5-year average of 375.7 million barrels.

## **Retail Prices**

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

**Regular Gasoline**— As of May 21, 2014, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average regular gasoline price equaled \$3.887/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$3.745/gallon, the statewide average has increased \$0.142/gallon (3.8%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

**Diesel**— As of May 21, 2014, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average diesel price equaled \$4.311/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$4.184/gallon, the statewide average has increased \$0.127/gallon (3.0%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.


## **Crude Oil Spot Prices**



WTI—For the week ending May 16, 2014, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$101.92/bbl, an increase of \$1.63/bbl (1.6%) from the prior week average of \$100.29/bbl. WTI prices are now \$7.27/bbl (7.7%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$94.65/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

**Brent**—For the week ending May 16, 2014, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$109.53/bbl, an increase of \$1.05/bbl (1.0%) from the week-ago average of \$108.48/bbl. Brent prices are now





\$6.62/bbl (6.4%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$102.91/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.
