

Highlights

- In the past week, the New York State average weekly retail gasoline price equaled \$3.934/gallon, up 0.2¢/gallon (0.0%) from the prior week and 22.0¢/gallon (5.9%) higher than the year-ago price.
- The New York State average weekly retail diesel price was \$4.281/gallon, down 0.4¢/gallon (0.1%) from the prior week and up 13.1¢/gallon (3.2%) from the year-ago price.
- Mid-Atlantic ULS diesel stocks increased by 1.1 million barrels (8.3%) to 14.1 million barrels and are now 18.1% below last year’s level of 17.3 million barrels and 21.8% above the 5-year average of 11.6 million barrels.

Retail Prices

Prices are from the “AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report.”

Regular Gasoline— As of July 9, 2014, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average regular gasoline price equaled \$3.930/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$3.718/gallon, the statewide average has increased \$0.212/gallon (5.7%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

Diesel— As of July 9, 2014, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average diesel price equaled \$4.284/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$4.150/gallon, the statewide average has increased \$0.134/gallon (3.2%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.

Crude Oil Spot Prices

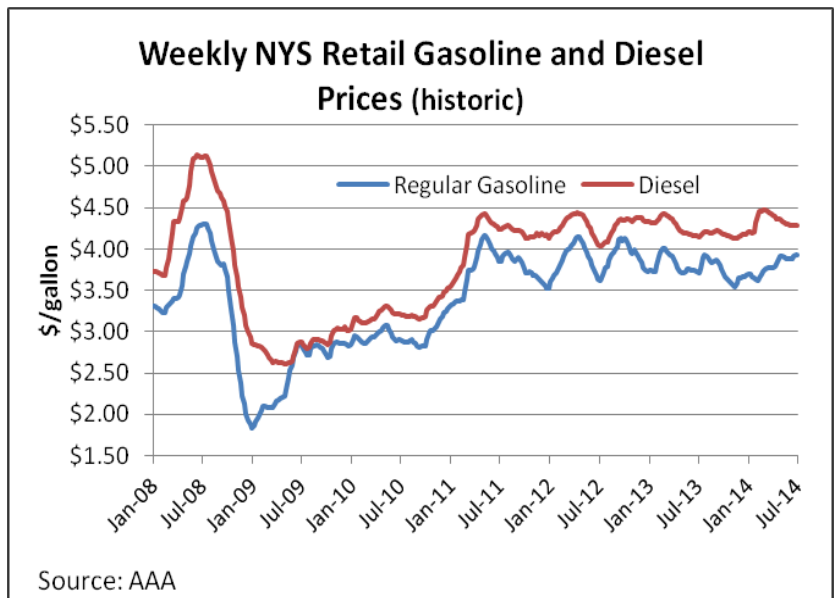
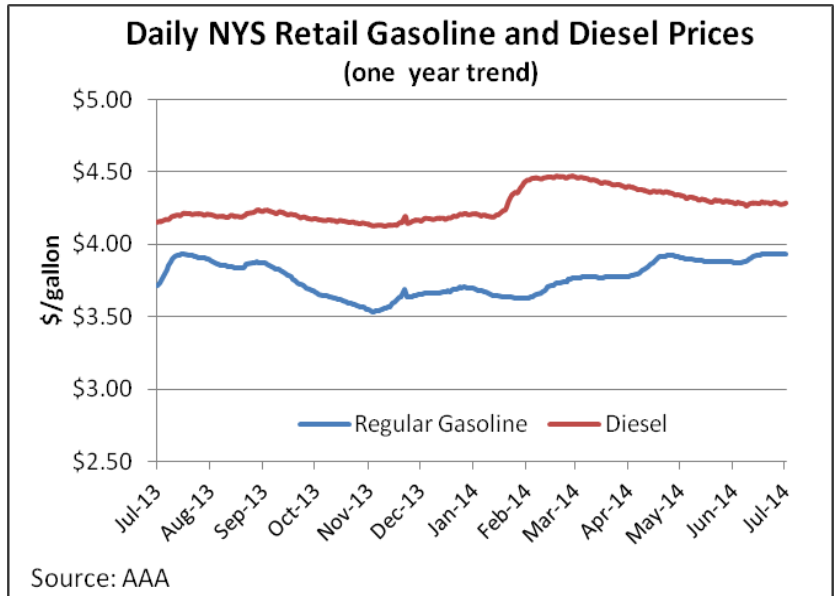

WTI—For the week ending July 4, 2014, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$105.52/bbl, a decrease of \$1.17/bbl (1.1%) from the prior week average of \$106.69/bbl. WTI prices are now \$4.87/bbl (4.8%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$100.65/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

Brent—For the week ending July 4, 2014, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$110.26/bbl, a decrease of \$2.83/bbl (2.5%) from the week-ago average of \$113.09/bbl. Brent prices are now \$5.08/bbl (4.8%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$105.18/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

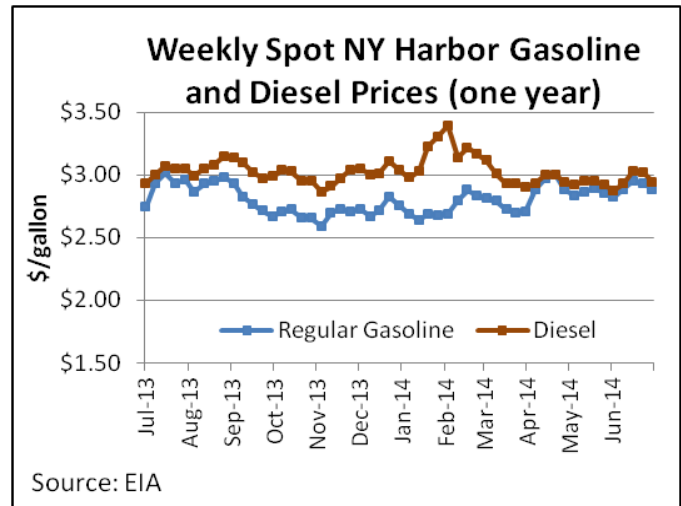

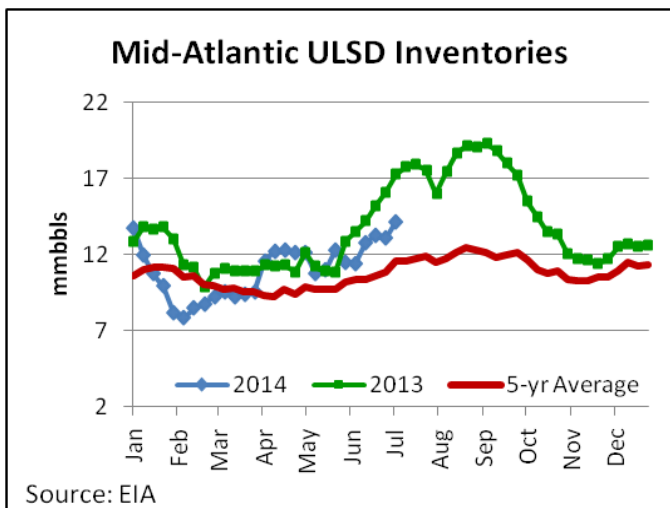
