## NYSERDA Transportation Fuels Report

## **Highlights**

- In the past week, the New York State average weekly retail gasoline price equaled \$3.865/gallon, down 2.7¢/gallon (0.7%) from the prior week and 6.6¢/gallon (1.7%) lower than the year-ago price.
- The New York State average weekly retail diesel price was \$4.240/gallon, down 1.6¢/gallon (0.4%) from the prior week and up 3.2¢/gallon (0.8%) from the year-ago price.
- Mid-Atlantic ULS diesel stocks increased by 0.9 million barrels (5.1%) to 18.0 million barrels and are now 2.7% above last year's level of 17.5 million barrels and 51.1% above the 5-year average of 11.9 million barrels.

## **Retail Prices**

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

**Regular Gasoline**— As of July 30, 2014, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average regular gasoline price equaled \$3.845/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$3.923/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.078/gallon (2.0%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

**Diesel**— As of July 30, 2014, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average diesel price equaled \$4.231/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$4.206/gallon, the statewide average has increased \$0.025/gallon (0.6%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.

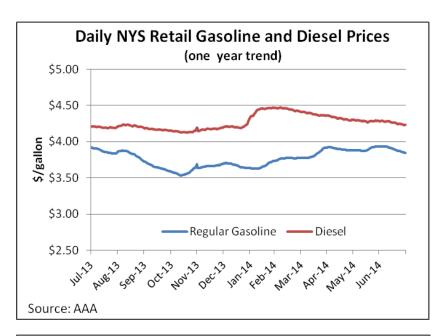
## **Crude Oil Spot Prices**

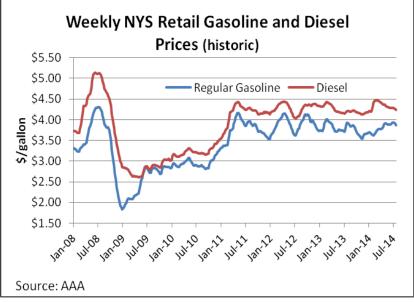

WTI—For the week ending July 25, 2014, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$104.35/bbl, an increase of \$1.98/bbl (1.9%) from the prior week average of \$102.37/bbl. WTI prices are now \$1.53/bbl (1.4%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$105.88/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

**Brent**—For the week ending July 25, 2014, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$106.34/bbl, an increase of \$0.95/bbl (0.9%) from the week-ago average of \$105.39/bbl. Brent prices are now \$2.06/bbl (1.9%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$108.40/bbl.





The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

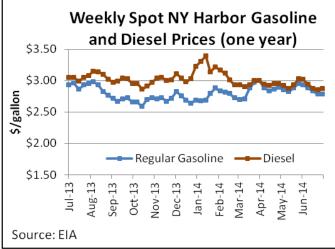

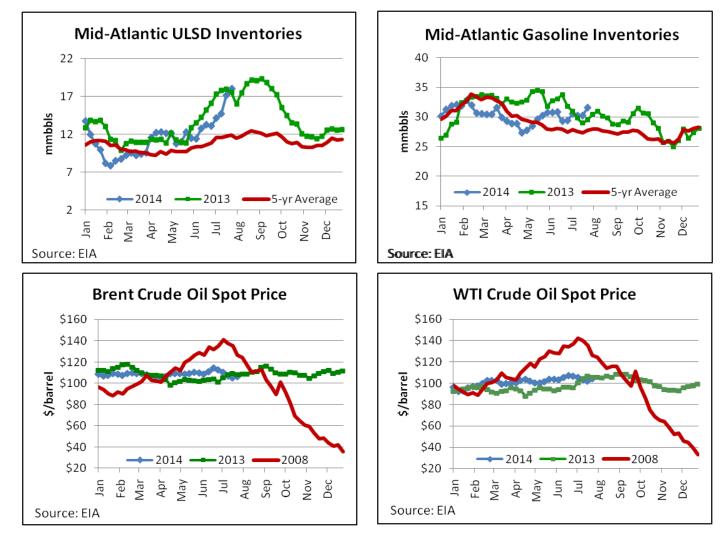
