NYSERDA Transportation Fuels Report

Highlights

- In the past week, the New York State average weekly retail gasoline price equaled \$3.684/gallon, down 1.1¢/gallon (0.3%) from the prior week and 16.6/gallon (4.3%) lower than the year-ago price.
- The New York State average weekly retail diesel price was \$4.124/gallon, down 0.6¢/gallon (0.2%) from the prior week and 10.0¢/gallon (2.4%) lower than the year-ago price.
- The weekly average WTI crude oil spot price decreased to \$92.43 per barrel, \$14.80 per barrel (13.8%) lower than the price 3 months ago, \$15.93 per barrel (14.7%) below last year's price and the lowest price since January.

Retail Prices

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

Regular Gasoline— As of September 17, 2014, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average regular gasoline price equaled \$3.662/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$3.832/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.170/gallon (4.4%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

Diesel— As of September 17, 2014, the most recent daily price available, the statewide average diesel price equaled \$4.111/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$4.216/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.105/gallon (2.5%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.


WTI—For the week ending September 12, 2014, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$92.43/bbl, a decrease of \$1.63/bbl (1.7%) from the prior week average of \$94.06/bbl. WTI prices are now \$15.93/bbl (14.7%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$108.36/bbl.


The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

Brent—For the week ending September 12, 2014, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$97.32/bbl, a decrease of \$3.13/bbl (3.1%) from the week-ago average of \$100.45/bbl. Brent prices are now

\$15.90/bbl (14.0%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$113.22/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.




