## **Highlights**

- The weekly average New York State retail diesel price increased \$0.010/gallon from last week's average to \$3.262/gallon but is still \$1.204/gallon (27.0%) below the 2014 weekly average peak price. This is the first time since June 2014 that the statewide weekly average has increased from the prior week.
- Mid-Atlantic ULS diesel stocks decreased by 15.5% from last week but are still 35.8% above last year's level and 16.8% above the five-year average.
- The weekly average North Sea Brent crude oil spot price has increased \$4.00/bbl from last week but is still \$49.17/bbl (44.8%) lower than last year's weekly average price of \$109.74/bbl.

## **Retail Prices**

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

**Regular Gasoline**— For the week ending February 23<sup>th</sup>, the New York State weekly retail gasoline price averaged \$2.475/gallon, an increase of \$0.034/gallon (1.4%) from last week's average price of \$2.441/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$3.697/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$1.222/gallon (33.1%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

**Diesel**— For the week ending February 23<sup>th</sup>, the New York State weekly retail diesel price averaged \$3.262/gallon, an increase of \$0.010/gallon (0.3%) from last week's average price of \$3.252/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$4.462/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$1.200/gallon (26.9%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.

## **Crude Oil Spot Prices**


WTI—For the week ending February 20, 2015, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$51.69/bbl, an increase of \$0.55/bbl (1.1%) from the prior week average of \$51.14/bbl. WTI prices are now \$51.24/bbl (49.8%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$102.93/bbl.


The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

**Brent**—For the week ending February 20, 2015,

Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$60.57/bbl, an increase of \$4.00/bbl (7.1%) from the week-ago average of \$56.57/bbl. Brent prices are now \$49.17/bbl (44.8%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$109.74/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.
