Highlights

- The weekly average New York State retail gasoline price increased for the seventh week in a row, increasing by \$0.015/gallon (0.5%) from last week's average to \$2.854/gallon but is \$1.032/gal (26.5%) lower than last year's weekly average of \$3.886/gallon.
- Mid-Atlantic ULS diesel stocks increased for the eighth week in a row to 16.5 million barrels, a 2.2% increase from last week. Mid-Atlantic ULS diesel stocks are 34.2% above last year's level of 12.3 million barrels.
- The weekly average U.S. gasoline demand increased 5.1% since last week and is now 4.6% higher than last year.

Retail Prices

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

Regular Gasoline— For the week ending May 25th, the New York State weekly retail gasoline price averaged \$2.854/gallon, an increase of \$0.015/gallon (0.5%) from last week's average of \$2.839/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$3.886/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$1.032/gallon (26.5%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

Diesel— For the week ending May 25th, the New York State weekly retail diesel price averaged \$3.271/gallon, with no change from last week's average price of \$3.271/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$4.304/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$1.033/gallon (24.0%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.





WTI—For the week ending May 22, 2015, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$58.95/bbl, a decrease of \$1.06/bbl (1.8%) from the prior week average of \$60.01/bbl. WTI prices are now \$44.87/bbl (43.2%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$103.82/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

Brent—For the week ending May 22, 2015, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$64.31/bbl, a decrease of \$0.59/bbl (0.9%) from the week-ago average of





\$64.90/bbl. Brent prices are now \$46.41/bbl (41.9%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$110.72/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.
