

Highlights

- The weekly average New York State retail diesel price decreased for the ninth week in a row to \$3.226/gallon from last week's average of \$3.240/gallon, and remains \$1.050/gallon (24.6%) below last year's weekly average price of \$4.276/gallon.
- Mid-Atlantic ULS diesel stocks increased for the fifteenth week in a row to 23.3 million barrels, a 4.7% increase from last week. Mid-Atlantic ULS diesel stocks are 58.8% above last year's level of 14.7 million barrels.
- The weekly average of WTI crude oil spot prices decreased for the second week in a row to \$52.38/bbl, a decrease of \$5.34/bbl (9.3%) from last week. WTI prices are \$50.87/bbl (49.3%) less than last year's weekly average price.

Retail Prices

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

Regular Gasoline— For the week ending July 13th, the New York State weekly retail gasoline price averaged \$2.938/gallon, a decrease of \$0.011/gallon (0.4%) from last week's average of \$2.949/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$3.921/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.983/gallon (25.1%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

Diesel— For the week ending July 13th, the New York State weekly retail diesel price averaged \$3.226/gallon, a decrease of \$0.014/gallon (0.4%) from last week's average price of \$3.240/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$4.276/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$1.050/gallon (24.6%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.

Crude Oil Spot Prices

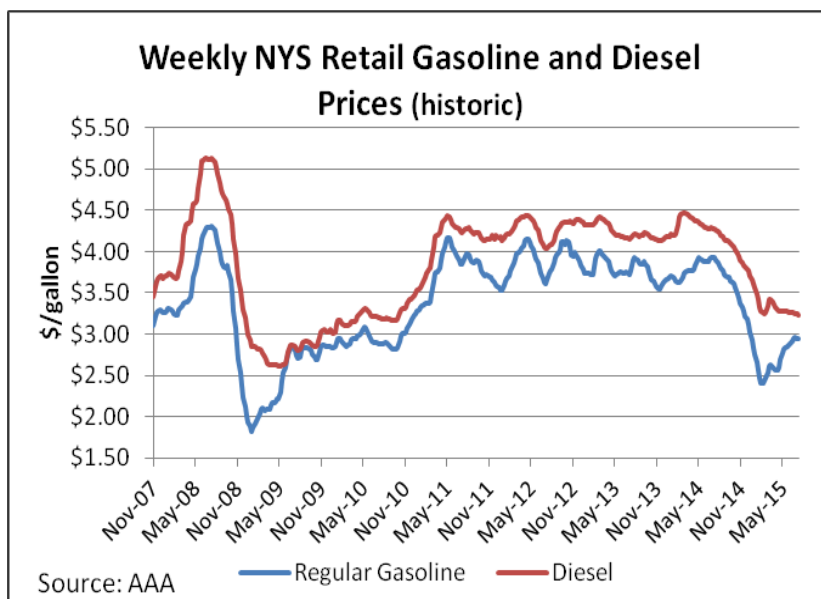
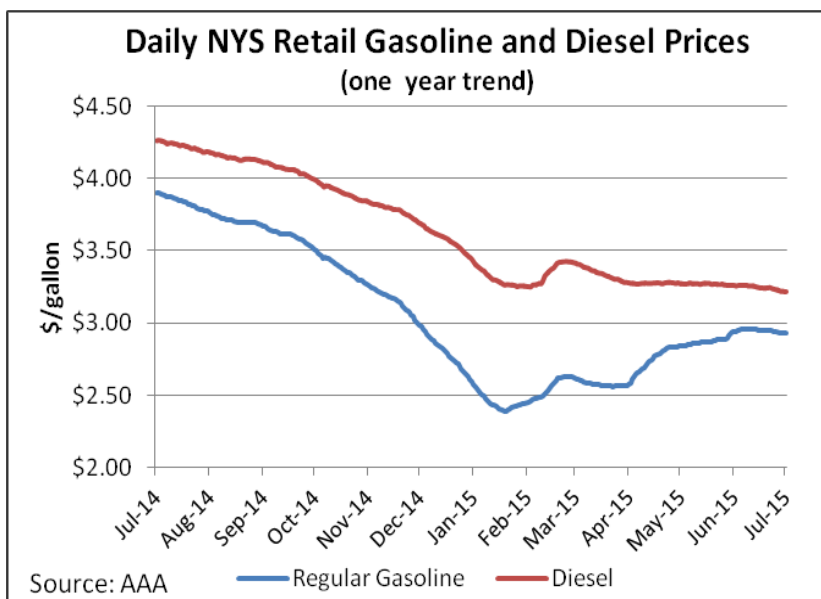

WTI—For the week ending July 10th, 2015, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$52.38/bbl, a decrease of \$5.34/bbl (9.3%) from the prior week average of \$57.72/bbl. WTI prices are now \$50.87/bbl (49.3%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$103.25/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

Brent—For the week ending July 10th, 2015, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$56.63/bbl, a decrease of \$3.73/bbl (6.2%) from the week-ago average of \$60.36/bbl. Brent prices are now \$50.40/bbl (47.1%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$107.03/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

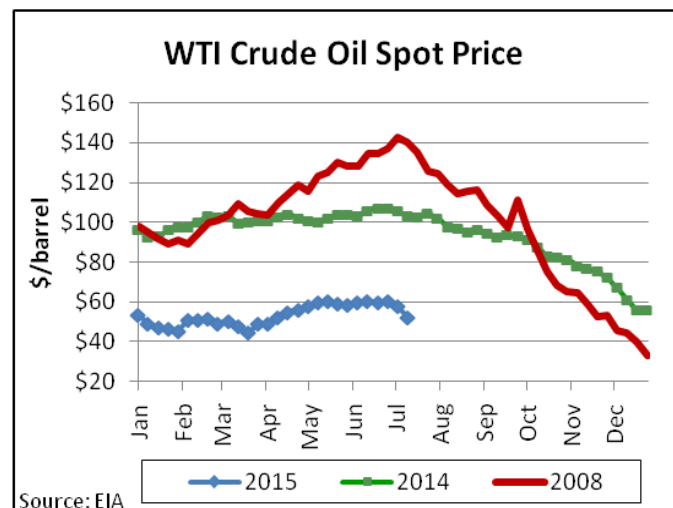
