

Highlights

- The weekly average New York State regular gasoline price increased for the third week in a row to \$2.090/gallon, and is \$0.485/gallon (18.8%) below last year's weekly average price of \$2.575/gallon.
- The weekly average West Texas Intermediate (WTI) crude oil spot price for the week ending March 25 increased for the sixth week in a row to \$39.18, increasing by 39.2% over the previous six weeks.
- Weekly U.S. crude oil inventories increased by 2.3 million barrels since last week to a new record level of 534.8 million barrels. U.S. crude oil inventories are now 63.4 million barrels (13.4%) above last year's level of 471.4 million barrels.

Retail Prices

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

Regular Gasoline— For the week ending March 28th, 2016 the New York State weekly retail gasoline price averaged \$2.090/gallon, an increase of \$0.058/gallon (2.8%) from last week's average of \$2.032/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$2.575/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.485/gallon (18.8%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

Diesel— For the week ending March 28th, 2016 the New York State weekly retail diesel price averaged \$2.363/gallon, an increase of \$0.016/gallon (0.7%) from last week's average price of \$2.347/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$3.352/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.989/gallon (29.5%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.

Crude Oil Spot Prices

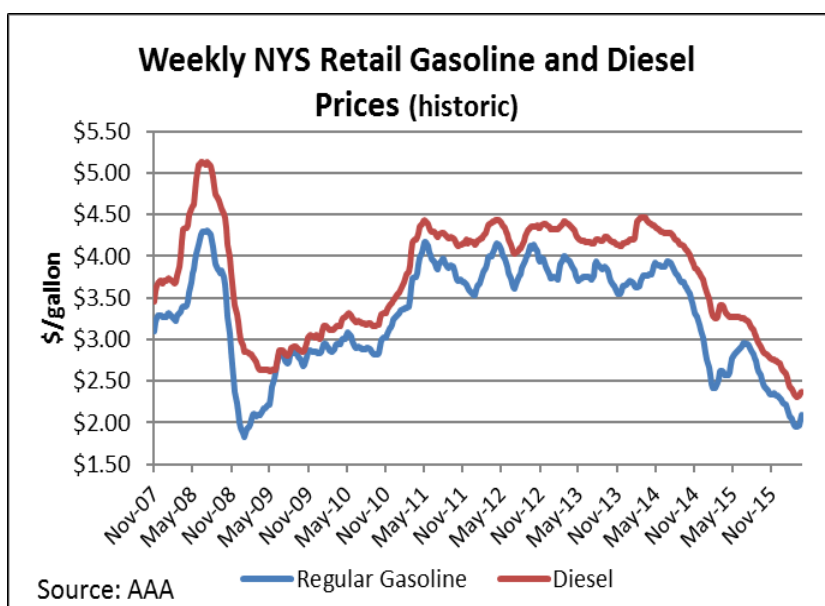
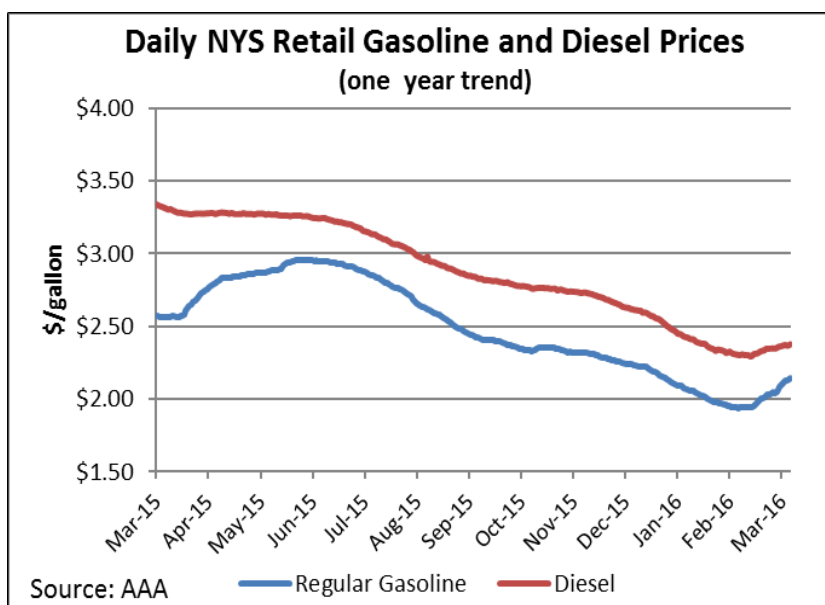

WTI—For the week ending March 25th, 2016, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$39.18/bbl, an increase of \$0.86/bbl (2.2%) from the prior week average of \$38.32/bbl. WTI prices are now \$9.50/bbl (19.5%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$48.68/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

Brent—For the week ending March 25th, 2016, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$39.19/bbl, an increase of \$0.69/bbl (1.8%) from the week-ago average of \$38.50/bbl. Brent prices are now \$15.82/bbl (28.8%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$55.01/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.
