## **Highlights**

- The weekly average New York State regular gasoline price increased for the twelfth week in a row to \$2.438/gallon, and is \$0.429/gallon (14.9%) below last year's weekly average price of \$2.867/gallon.
- Weekly Mid-Atlantic gasoline inventories decreased by 1.0 million barrels (2.6%) since last week to 36.8 million barrels and are now 4.7 million barrels (14.5%) higher than the prior year level of 32.1 million barrels.
- Weekly U.S. crude oil inventories decreased by 1.4 million barrels since last week to 535.7 million barrels and are now 58.3 million barrels (12.2%) above last year's level of 477.4 million barrels.

## **Retail Prices**

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

**Regular Gasoline**— For the week ending May 30<sup>th</sup>, 2016 the New York State weekly retail gasoline price averaged \$2.438/gallon, an increase of \$0.030/gallon (1.3%) from last week's average of \$2.408/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$2.867/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.429/gallon (14.9%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

**Diesel**— For the week ending May 30<sup>th</sup>, 2016 the New York State weekly retail diesel price averaged \$2.522/gallon, an increase of \$0.032/gallon (1.3%) from last week's average price of \$2.490/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$3.269/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.747/gallon (22.9%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.


## **Crude Oil Spot Prices**



WTI—For the week ending May 27th, 2016, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$48.72/bbl, an increase of \$0.73/bbl (1.5%) from the prior week average of \$47.99/bbl. WTI prices are now \$9.47/bbl (16.3%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$58.19/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

**Brent**—For the week ending May 27<sup>th</sup>, 2016, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$48.73/bbl, an increase





of \$0.39/bbl (0.8%) from the week-ago average of \$48.34/bbl. Brent prices are now \$12.84/bbl (20.9%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$61.57/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.
