Highlights

- The weekly average New York State regular gasoline price increased by \$0.002/gallon since last week and the current price is now \$2.394/gallon, 1.7% higher than the year-ago price of \$2.353/gallon.
- Weekly U.S. crude oil inventories increased by 5.3 million barrels since last week to 490.3 million barrels and are now 35.2 million barrels (7.7%) higher than last year's level of 455.1 million barrels.
- Mid-Atlantic gasoline inventories increased by 1.0 million barrels (3.7%) since last week to 29.0 million barrels and are now 1.2 million barrels (4.2%) above last year's level of 27.8 million barrels.

Retail Prices

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

Regular Gasoline— For the week ending November 14th, 2016 the New York State weekly retail gasoline price averaged \$2.394/gallon, an increase of \$0.002/gallon (0.1%) from last week's average of \$2.392/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$2.353/gallon, the statewide average has increased \$0.041/gallon (1.7%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

Diesel— For the week ending November 14th, 2016 the New York State weekly retail diesel price averaged \$2.611/gallon, an increase of \$0.001/gallon (0.1%) from last week's average price of \$2.610/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$2.760/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.149/gallon (5.4%).


The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.


Crude Oil Spot Prices

WTI – For the week ending November 11th, 2016 WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$44.61/bbl, a decrease of \$0.90/bbl (2.0%) from the week-ago average of \$45.51/bbl. WTI prices are now \$1.91 (4.5%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$42.70/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.





Brent - For the week ending November 11th, 2016, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$43.09/bbl, a decrease of \$1.54/bbl (3.5%) from the week-ago average of \$44.63/bbl. Brent prices are now \$1.66/bbl (3.7%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$44.75/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.
