NYSERDA Transportation Fuels Report

Highlights

- U.S. crude oil inventories decreased by 1.5 million barrels (0.3%) since last week to 481.9 million barrels, the lowest level since December 2016. Inventories are now 10.0 million barrels (2.0%) below the year-ago level of 491.9 million barrels.
- The weekly average WTI crude oil spot price is \$48.27 per barrel, \$1.86 per barrel (4.0%) higher than last week's average and is now \$6.44 per barrel (15.4%) above the year-ago price of \$41.83 per barrel.
- The weekly average New York State regular gasoline price increased by \$0.017/gallon (0.7%) since last week and the current price is now \$2.442/gallon, 4.2% higher than the year-ago price of \$2.344/gallon.

Retail Prices

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

Regular Gasoline— For the week ending July 31st, 2017 the New York State weekly retail gasoline price averaged \$2.442/gallon, an increase of \$0.017/gallon (0.7%) from last week's average of \$2.425/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$2.344/gallon, the statewide average has increased \$0.098/gallon (4.2%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

Diesel— For the week ending July 31st, 2017 the New York State weekly retail diesel price averaged \$2.658/gallon, an increase of \$0.008/gallon (0.3%) from last week's average price of \$2.650/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$2.526/gallon the statewide average has increased \$0.132/gallon (5.2%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.




WTI – For the week ending July 28th, 2017, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$48.27/bbl, an increase of \$1.86/bbl (4.0%) from the week-ago average of \$46.41/bbl. WTI prices are now \$6.44/bbl (15.4%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$41.83/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

Brent - For the week ending July 28th, 2017, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$49.95/bbl, an increase of \$1.96/bbl (4.1%) from the week-ago average of \$47.99/bbl. Brent prices are now \$7.40/bbl (17.4%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$42.55/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.








