Highlights

- Mid-Atlantic gasoline inventories decreased by 0.5 million barrels (1.8%) since last week to 24.0 million barrels. Inventories are 4.0 million barrels (14.1%) below the year-ago average and 8.1% below the five-year average.
- The weekly average Brent crude oil spot price increased by \$2.46 per barrel (4.2%) since last week to \$61.04 per barrel. The price is now \$16.41 per barrel (36.8%) above last year's price of \$44.63 per barrel.
- The weekly average New York State regular gasoline price is \$2.653/gallon, \$0.010/gallon (0.4%) above last week's average of \$2.643/gallon. Prices are now \$0.259 (10.8%) above the year-ago price of \$2.394/gallon.

Retail Prices

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

Regular Gasoline— For the week ending November 6th, 2017 the New York State weekly retail gasoline price averaged \$2.653/gallon, an increase of \$0.010/gallon (0.4%) from last week's average of \$2.643/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$2.394/gallon, the statewide average has increased \$0.259/gallon (10.8%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

Diesel— For the week ending November 6th, 2017 the New York State weekly retail diesel price averaged \$2.863/gallon, an increase of \$0.012/gallon (0.4%) from last week's average price of \$2.851/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$2.610/gallon the statewide average has increased \$0.253/gallon (9.7%).

The all-time high of \$5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.


WTI – For the week ending November 3rd, 2017, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$54.59/bbl, an increase of \$2.08/bbl (4.0%) from the week-ago average of \$52.51/bbl. WTI prices are now \$9.08/bbl (20.0%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$45.51/bbl.


The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

Brent - For the week ending November 3rd, 2017, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$61.04/bbl, an increase of \$2.46/bbl (4.2%) from the week-ago average of \$58.58/bbl. Brent prices are now

16.41/bbl (36.8%) above the year-ago weekly average of 44.63/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.
