Highlights

- The weekly average WTI crude oil spot price increased by \$2.95/bbl (4.7%) since last week to \$66.02/bbl, the highest average price since December 2014. Current prices are \$12.83/bbl (24.1%) above the year-ago price.
- Mid-Atlantic ultra-low sulfur distillate inventories decreased by 2.0 million barrels (10.2%) since last week to 17.5 million barrels. Inventories are now 36.8% below the year-ago level and 3.3% below the 5-year average.
- The average New York State regular gasoline price increased \$0.022 (0.8%) this week to \$2.789. Current prices are \$0.280 (11.2%) above the year-ago price of \$2.509.

Retail Prices

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

Regular Gasoline— For the week ending April 16th, 2018 the New York State weekly retail gasoline price averaged \$2.789/gallon, an increase of \$0.022/gallon (0.8%) from last week's average of \$2.767/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$2.509/gallon, the statewide average has increased \$0.280/gallon (11.2%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9th, 2008.

Diesel— For the week ending April 16th, 2018 the New York State weekly retail diesel price averaged \$3.178/gallon, an increase of \$0.009/gallon (0.3%) from last week's average price of \$3.169/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$2.725/gallon the statewide average has increased \$0.453/gallon (16.6%).

The all-time high of 5.138/gallon occurred on June 18th, 2008.





WTI – For the week ending April 16th, 2018, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$66.02/bbl, an increase of \$2.95/bbl (4.7%) from the week-ago average of \$63.07/bbl. WTI prices are now \$12.83/bbl (24.1%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$53.19/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.

Brent -For the week ending April 16th, 2018, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$71.24/bbl, an increase of \$4.21/bbl (6.3%) from the week-ago average of





\$67.03/bbl. Brent prices are now \$16.41/bbl (29.9%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$54.83/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.
