## **Highlights**

- The weekly average Brent crude oil spot price increased by \$1.59/bbl (2.2%) since last week to \$74.98/bbl, the highest average price since November 2014. Current prices are \$25.43/bbl (51.3%) above the year-ago price.
- Mid-Atlantic ultra-low sulfur distillate inventories decreased by 0.9 million barrels (5.7%) since last week to 15.2 million barrels. Inventories are now 48.3% below the year-ago level and 18.5% below the 5-year average.
- The average New York State regular gasoline price increased \$0.068/gallon (2.4%) since last week to \$2.923/gallon. Current prices are \$0.386/gallon (15.2%) above the year-ago price of \$2.537/gallon.

## **Retail Prices**

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

**Regular Gasoline**— For the week ending April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2018 the New York State weekly retail gasoline price averaged \$2.923/gallon, an increase of \$0.068/gallon (2.4%) from last week's average of \$2.855/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$2.537/gallon, the statewide average has increased \$0.386/gallon (15.2%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9<sup>th</sup>, 2008.

**Diesel**— For the week ending April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2018 the New York State weekly retail diesel price averaged \$3.237/gallon, an increase of \$0.032/gallon (1.0%) from last week's average price of \$3.205/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$2.732/gallon the statewide average has increased \$0.505/gallon (18.5%).

The all-time high of 5.138/gallon occurred on June 18<sup>th</sup>, 2008.


## **Crude Oil Spot Prices**



**WTI** – For the week ending April 27<sup>h</sup>, 2018, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$67.91/bbl, an increase of \$0.36/bbl (0.5%) from the week-ago average of \$49.12/bbl. WTI prices are now \$18.79/bbl (38.3%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$49.12/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4<sup>th</sup>, 2008.

**Brent** -For the week ending April 27<sup>th</sup>, 2018, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$74.98/bbl, an increase of \$1.59/bbl (2.2%) from the week-ago average of





\$73.39/bbl. Brent prices are now \$25.43/bbl (51.3%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$49.55/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4<sup>th</sup>, 2008.
