The Bid Facility is a zero-emission solar energy facility that will assist the state in meeting the goals of the Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act, which includes obtaining 70% of energy generation from renewable sources by 2030 and significantly reducing greenhouse gas emissions. Other positive impacts of the Facility include diversification of energy supplies, new employment opportunities (both temporary construction and full-time operations and maintenance positions), increased revenues to the Town of Fort Edward, Franklin County, local schools, payments to participating landowners, support of the local construction and hospitality industries, and purchase of local goods and supplies. The Bid Facility team has worked tirelessly to minimize impacts. With a particular focus on limiting impacts to wetlands, streams, agricultural resources, forests and more. Furthermore, the Bid Facility benefits from robust and enthusiastic support from its host community, as evidenced by this quote from Supervisor Pat Manchester, "Throughout the time Boralex has been developing the project, they have done an excellent job of explaining the benefits to our community.
