



Dear Contractors,

Uncommitted megawatts remain in various MW Block sectors, regions and blocks, due to past solar project cancellations. We are now adding those uncommitted megawatts to the current MW Block within the same sector and region so they will be available for use.

The following current blocks are affected:

- Upstate Residential (Block 6): increase from 31 MW to a total of 35 MWs
- Con Edison Residential (Block 5): increase from 15 MW to a total of 17 MWs
- Upstate Non-Residential (Block 7): increase from 26 MW to a total of 31 MWs
- Con Ed Non-Residential (Block 3): increase from 6MW to a total of 7.5 MWs

At this time, the following has no change:

- Long Island Non-Residential

As a reminder:

- Long Island Residential unused funds have already been added to Block #4 as announced on November 5, 2015
