

# New York State Appliance and Equipment Efficiency Standards



## Compliance Requirements – Foodservice Equipment

New York State has adopted appliance and equipment efficiency regulations that will impact what products can be legally sold, rented, leased, and installed in New York as a result of the [Advanced Building Codes, Appliance and Equipment Efficiency Standards Act of 2022](#)<sup>1</sup>. New York established standards for the following consumer products and appliances manufactured on or after **June 26, 2023**:

- Commercial dishwashers
- Commercial fryers
- Commercial hot food holding cabinets
- Commercial ovens
- Commercial steam cookers

The New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA) is available to help you comply with these appliance and equipment standards.

### Roles and Responsibilities

The entire supply chain has responsibilities within the compliance process, including manufacturers, distributors, dealers, retailers, installers, contractors, and leasing companies.

#### Manufacturers

Before selling any of the five foodservice products listed above into New York, manufacturers must:

- Ensure their products meet the efficiency requirements.
- Test the products in accordance with the required test procedure.
- Certify the products to the [State Appliance Standards Database \(SASD\)](#)<sup>2</sup>.

#### SASD Certification Instructions

- Create an account on the SASD using [these instructions](#)<sup>3</sup>.
- Once your account is approved, confirm the brands associated with your company (there may be products in the SASD already waiting for your approval).
- If there are additional products you'd like to certify, review the upload instructions found on the [SASD Resource - Compliance FAQ](#)<sup>4</sup>.
- Upload product data using the template provided on the Product Import page.
- Receive notification that product data has been approved or denied.

#### Distributors, Dealers, Retailers, Installers, Contractors, and Leasing Companies

Distributors, dealers, retailers, installers, contractors, and leasing companies should verify that regulated products are certified to the applicable database before selling, leasing, renting, or installing the product.

### Risks of Noncompliance

Any manufacturer, distributor, dealer, retailer, installer, contractor, or leasing company who sells, leases, rents, or installs products in New York that do not comply with these standards may be subject to financial penalties, including fines of up to five-hundred dollars for each violation and one-hundred dollars for each day in violation.

## SASD Verification Process

1. Visit [SASD](#)<sup>5</sup> and either:
  - Use the filters to select the product category that you are verifying for compliance
  - Type in the model number or brand name using the search bar
2. If you cannot find the product you're looking for, download the search results for a single product category using the Export Products button. Use the Excel search function 'Find' to search for the model number you are verifying.
3. If you still cannot find the product you're looking for, reach out to the manufacturer to inform them of the SASD and ask them to submit product data. If a manufacturer submits product data and it does not meet the standards, it cannot legally be sold. ## Benefits to New Yorkers

State appliance standards have proven to be one of the most cost-effective strategies to achieve energy, water, greenhouse gas emissions savings, and reduce utility costs for New Yorkers. Product and appliance standards also protect consumers by helping remove inefficient products from the market. Compliance with these standards is crucial to achieve these benefits.

Assuming full market compliance with New York State's Appliance and Equipment Standards, by 2035 consumers can save:

- \$264 million annually on utility bills
  - \$85 million benefitting low- to moderate- income households
- 807,000 metric tons of greenhouse gas emissions
- 25 billion gallons of annual water savings
