


Federal Consistency Review:

Federal consistency is a provision of the Coastal Zone Management Act (CZMA) that provides states with an important tool to manage coastal uses and resources, and to facilitate coordination with Federal agencies. To administer NYS' Coastal Management Program, the New York State Department of State collaborates with local governments, State agencies, and federal partners through the Office of Planning, Development and Community Infrastructure.

Renewable Energy Geographic Location Description:

The Renewable Energy Geographic Location Description is a planning tool prescribed in the CZMA to provide regulatory certainty and ensure New Yorks's coastal uses and resources will be considered early in federal decision-making. New York's Geographic Location Description is rooted in empirical data and facts, promotes predictable and coordinated reviews, and encourages sustainable offshore renewable energy development on the Outer Continental Shelf.

The Gateway's suite of information and tools serves as a valuable resource for New York communities, an educational resource for schools and universities, and a guide for the responsible development of the State's resources.

LEADING NEW YORK'S OCEAN POLICY


The Program collaborates to advance ocean planning and guide shared regional priorities:

ADVANCING SUSTAINABLE OCEAN MANAGEMENT

Ocean and Great Lakes staff review and provide technical support on projects offshore New York:

- Promoting the State's interests in offshore leasing and environmental reviews
- Leading the State's involvement in designating the Hudson Canyon as a National Marine Sanctuary
- Chairing the Maritime Technical Working Group that advises NY on maritime transportation and offshore wind matters

The Ocean and Great Lakes Division's responsibilities stretch statewide, touching diverse areas and interests including coastal resiliency and shoreline protection; marine transportation and port infrastructure; and offshore habitat protection.
