Resources for Minority and Women-Owned Business Enterprises (MWBEs) in Renewable Energy

These programs provide incubation, training, and support for MWBEs looking to enter or grow within the renewable energy industry. These resources—offered by government agencies, nonprofits, and private companies—support MWBEs through certification guidance, access to supply chains, capacity-building, and funding opportunities. Resources for Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Businesses (SDVOBs) and Small Business Enterprises are also included.

Offshore Wind

NYC Waterfront Pathways Program – New York City Economic Development Corporation (NYCEDC)

This program increases access for MWBEs to offshore wind and waterfront projects in NYC. Participants receive top-tier training, technical assistance, and the opportunity to become prequalified for NYCEDC contracts.

We Source NYC connects NYC manufacturers, suppliers, and service providers—especially MWBEs—with offshore wind supply chain opportunities. The initiative identifies high-demand goods like electrical components, steel, paints, and safety equipment, which can be locally sourced.

How to Get MWBE Certified

New York City MWBE Certification:

- Administered by: New York City Department of Small Business Services (SBS).
- Eligibility: Businesses must be at least 51% owned, operated, and controlled by U.S. citizens or permanent residents who are women and/or members of recognized minority groups.
- Benefits: Certification allows businesses to compete for contracts with NYC agencies and prime contractors, and to be listed in the NYC Online Directory of Certified Businesses, increasing visibility to potential buyers.

New York State MWBE Certification:

- Administered by: Empire State Development (ESD),
 Division of Minority and Women's Business Development.
- **Eligibility:** Similar ownership and control requirements as the city's program.
- Benefits: Certification provides access to state contracts, inclusion in the New York State Contract System directory, and exemption from competitive bidding requirements for procurements under \$200,000.

Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Businesses (SDVOBs)
