A Community Solar project is a group of solar panels installed in a sunny location. Homeowners, renters, and businesses can subscribe in order to access the clean energy produced by the panels, and get credits on their electric bills.

You don't need to be a property owner or even have a rooftop to subscribe to a community solar project. You just need to have an electric bill, and a desire to save.

How it works

Subscribe. By subscribing, you'll become a part of a community solar project near you, and you'll be helping to bring clean energy to your area.

Save. Energy will be delivered to you the same way it always has been, from your electric provider. You'll be credited right on your electric bill for your portion of the solar panels.
