## Appendix D Survey Answers

The survey’s skip logic did not pose a given question when either the information was already known to the research team from the program database or the respondent’s answer to a previous question indicated it would be inappropriate to ask the given question.

Due to rounding when the weights were applied, some percent totals do not equal precisely 100% and some counts do not equal precisely 1600 local governments. Differences from 100% and 1600 are very small.
