


Highlights

- Mid-Atlantic ultra-low sulfur (ULS) distillate inventories, including diesel fuel and New York State heating oil, have declined for ten weeks in a row. Inventories have declined by 39.7% over that time period but remain 25.5% above the 5-year average.
- U.S. WTI crude oil prices have declined in nine of the past ten weeks by a total of \$14.83/bbl or 13.6%.
- New York statewide average retail prices for ultra-low sulfur (ULS) heating oil, kerosene, and propane all increased from the previous week.

Retail Petroleum Prices—On a statewide basis since the last survey on November 11th, prices increased 1.0¢/gallon (0.3%) to 390.3¢/gallon for ULS heating oil, 2.6¢/gallon (0.6%) to 424.7¢/gallon for kerosene, and 4.4¢/gallon (1.6%) to 288.1¢/gallon for propane. Compared to a year earlier, prices decreased 23.6¢/gallon (5.7%) for heating oil, 12.2¢/gallon (2.8%) for kerosene and increased 19.3¢/gallon (7.2%) for propane.

Crude Oil Prices—For the week ending 11/15/13, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$93.94/bbl, a decrease of \$0.37/bbl (0.4%) from the week-ago average of \$94.31/bbl. WTI prices are now \$8.07/bbl (9.4%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$85.87/bbl. The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred on 7/03/08.

Spot Natural Gas Prices—For the week ending 11/15/13, Henry Hub natural gas spot prices averaged \$3.594 per million Btu (mmBtu), an increase of \$0.126/mmBtu (3.6%) from the prior week level of \$3.468/mmBtu. Prices are currently \$0.042/mmBtu (1.2%) above the year-earlier weekly average of \$3.552/mmBtu.



Residential Natural Gas Prices—The NYS average price in August 2013 was \$1.882/therm, an increase of \$0.051/therm (2.8%) from the prior month of \$1.831/therm, and was \$0.134/therm (7.7%) higher than the year earlier average of \$1.748/therm.


- Heating oil—highest price 477.8¢/gallon on 7/14/08, lowest price 87.6¢/gallon on 9/08/98.

Heating Degree Days—On a statewide basis during the past week, the number of heating degree days (163) was 16.4% above the year-ago level of (140) and 7.9% above the normal trend (151). On a cumulative basis since October 1st, current year heating degree days (638) are behind the year-ago level (663) by 3.8% and trail the normal trend (745) by 14.4%.






