NYSERDA Heating Fuels Report


Highlights

- Mid-Atlantic ultra-low sulfur (ULS) distillate inventories increased 0.4 million barrels (2.1%) since last week to 16.8 million barrels. Current inventories are 24.9% above last year's level but 15.0% below the 5-year average.
- The weekly average WTI crude oil spot price decreased by \$1.09 per barrel (1.7%) to \$61.81 per barrel since last week. The weekly average price is now 12.4% below last year's level of \$70.56 per barrel.
- New York Statewide average retail prices of ultra-low sulfur (ULS) heating oil, kerosene, and propane all decreased since the last survey.

Retail Petroleum Prices—On a statewide basis since the last survey on April 29th, prices decreased \$0.018/gallon (0.6%) to \$3.250/gallon for ULS heating oil, \$0.008/gallon (0.2%) to \$3.645/gallon for kerosene and \$0.035/gallon (1.2%) to \$2.908/gallon for propane. Compared to a year earlier, the price decreased \$0.003/gallon (0.1%) for heating oil, the price increased \$0.022/gallon (0.6%) for kerosene, and the price decreased \$0.043/gallon (1.5%) for propane.

Crude Oil Prices—For the week ending 5/10/19, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$61.81/bbl, a decrease of \$1.09/bbl (1.7%) from the week-ago average of \$62.90/bbl. WTI prices are now \$8.75/bbl (12.4%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$70.56/bbl. The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred on 7/04/08.

Spot Natural Gas Prices—For the week ending 5/10/19, Henry Hub natural gas spot prices averaged \$2.558 per million Btu (mmBtu), a decrease of \$0.034/mmBtu (1.3%) from the prior week level of \$2.592/mmBtu. Prices are currently \$0.166/mmBtu (6.1%) below the year-earlier weekly average of \$2.724/mmBtu.



Residential Natural Gas Prices—The NYS average price in February 2019 was \$1.111/therm, a decrease of \$0.075/therm(6.3%) from the January 2019 price of \$1.186/therm, and was \$0.023/therm(2.1%) more than the year earlier average of \$1.088/therm.





- Kerosene—highest price \$5.068/gallon on 7/14/08, lowest price \$1.309/gallon on 9/09/02.



Heating Degree Days—Until the start of the next heating season in October, the heating degree-day information below reflects weekly information through April 27, 2019. Cumulative statewide heating degree-days from October 1st through April 27th end the current season at 5,740, which is ahead of the year-ago level (5,739) by 0.0% and ahead of the normal trend (5,722) by 0.3%.






Propane Stocks—Current and historic heating fuel inventory data is presented in the graphs below.








Statewide Forecast HDD: On a statewide basis for the week ending May 18th, the number of forecasted heating degree-days (76) is 61.7% more than last year (47) and 43.4% more than the normal trend (53). Regional HDD forecasts are provided in the map and table below.
