## NYSERDA Heating Fuels Report

## December 23, 2019


## **Highlights**

- Mid-Atlantic ultra-low sulfur (ULS) distillate inventories decreased 1.7 million barrels (9.0%) since last week to 17.1 million barrels. Current inventories are 0.9% below last year's level and 29.1% below the 5-year average.
- For the week ending December 21<sup>st</sup>, New York statewide heating degree-days (271) were more than last year (201) by 34.8% and more than the 30-year normal (242) by 12.0%.
- New York Statewide average retail prices of ultra-low sulfur (ULS) heating oil, kerosene, and propane all increased since the last survey.

**Retail Petroleum Prices**—On a statewide basis since the last survey on December 16<sup>th</sup>, prices increased \$0.031/gallon (1.0%) to \$3.281/gallon for ULS heating oil, \$0.040/gallon (1.1%) to \$3.673/gallon for kerosene, and \$0.018/gallon (0.6%) to \$2.865/gallon for propane. Compared to a year earlier, prices increased \$0.091/gallon (2.9%) for heating oil, \$0.054/gallon (1.5%) for kerosene, and the price decreased \$0.104/gallon (3.5%) for propane.

**Crude Oil Prices**—For the week ending 12/20/19, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$60.75/bbl, an increase of \$1.50/bbl (2.5%) from the week-ago average of \$59.25/bbl. WTI prices are now \$13.77/bbl (29.3%) above the year-ago weekly average of \$46.98/bbl. The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred on 7/04/08.

**Spot Natural Gas Prices**—For the week ending 12/20/19, Henry Hub natural gas spot prices averaged \$2.268 per million Btu (mmBtu), an increase of \$0.052/mmBtu (2.3%) from the prior week level of \$2.216/mmBtu. Prices are currently \$1.350/mmBtu (37.3%) below the year-earlier weekly average of \$3.618/mmBtu.



**Residential Natural Gas Prices**—The NYS average price in September 2019 was \$1.942/therm, a decrease of \$0.015/therm (0.8%) from the August 2019 price of \$1.957/therm, and was \$0.011/therm (0.6%) lower than the year earlier average of \$1.953/therm.

Historic Retail Prices—Statewide average high and low prices since Sept. 1997 for heating oil & propane & Sept. 2000 for kerosene.


- Heating oil—highest price \$4.778/gallon on 7/14/08, lowest price \$0.876/gallon on 9/08/98.

- Kerosene—highest price \$5.068/gallon on 7/14/08, lowest price \$1.309/gallon on 9/09/02.



**Heating Degree Days**— On a statewide basis during the past week, the number of heating degree-days (271) was 34.8% above the year-ago level (201) and 12.0% above the normal trend (242). On a cumulative basis since October  $1^{st}$ , current year heating degree-days (1,895) are the same as the year-ago level (1,895) and ahead of the normal trend (1,775) by 6.8%.






Propane Stocks—Current and historic heating fuel inventory data is presented in the graphs below.




**Retail Btu Price Equivalents**—The New York State heating fuel prices Btu graph equates the retail price for New York Statewide average residential ultra-low sulfur heating oil, kerosene, propane, and natural gas on a dollar per million Btu (MMBtu) basis.



Note: Natural gas prices are from the U.S. EIA and provided on a monthly basis and delayed by 3 months. The monthly average price of natural gas is higher during the summer months due to low delivery volumes and fixed delivery charges and does not necessarily indicate a higher underlying supply price. Higher average natural gas prices in the summer months are not indicative of higher future prices during the winter months.



**Spot Btu Price Equivalents**—The Btu spot market graph equates the spot market price, in table below, for NY Harbor ultra-low sulfur diesel fuel and 0.3% sulfur high pour #6 residual fuel, Mont Belvieu propane, and the New York Citygate natural gas price on a dollar per million Btu (MMBtu) basis.






**Statewide Forecast HDD**: On a statewide basis for the week ending December 28<sup>th</sup>, the number of forecasted heating degree-days (180) is 10.0% below last year (200) and 27.7% below the normal trend (249). Regional HDD forecasts are provided in the map and table below.





**6-10 Day Outlook** Temperature Probability from the Climate Prediction Center (NOAA). The forecasted map presents the 6-10 day temperature probability outlook for the United States for December 31, 2019 – January 4, 2020. This is in comparison to the 30-year normal (1981-2010).

**8-14 Day Outlook** Temperature Probability from the Climate Prediction Center (NOAA). The forecasted map presents the 8-14 day temperature probability outlook for the United States for January 2, 2020 – January 8, 2020. This is in comparison to the 30-year normal (1981-2010).
